BACKGROUND

- On January 7, 2010, the Port of Moses Lake (Port or Petitioner) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) five petitions seeking approval to construct or reconstruct various highway-rail grade crossings as part of the North Columbia Basin Rail Project (NCBRP) in the vicinity of Moses Lake, Grant County. One petition (Petition) requested approval to construct a new crossing at Randolph Road, identified as USDOT 923004C.
- 2 On January 28, 2010, the Commission issued Order 01 approving the Petition.
- In July 2022, Commission Staff (Staff) learned that the Port had revised its plans for the NCBRP and the five crossing projects approved in 2010 were no longer in the project plan. Staff requested the Port send a written request to the Commission to withdraw these five petitions.
- 4 On February 23, 2024, Port Facilities Director Milt Miller submitted a letter confirming that the NCBRP plan had changed significantly and that the Port wished to withdraw its crossing petitions from January 2010.
- 5 Staff supports the Port's request and recommends the Commission rescind the approval for construction of the crossing granted in Order 01.

DISCUSSION

RCW 81.53.060 requires that the Commission grant approval prior to the construction of a new highway-rail crossing. We agree with Staff's recommendation. We rescind the authority we granted to the Port in Order 01 without prejudice to the Port's ability to submit additional petitions related to this project in the future.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- 7 (1) The Commission is an agency of the State of Washington having jurisdiction over public crossings within the state of Washington.
- 8 (2) RCW 81.53.060 requires that the Commission grant approval prior to the construction of a new crossing, or the alteration in the method and manner of an existing crossing. See also WAC 480-62-150.
- 9 (3) Staff investigated the Port's request to withdraw its Petition and recommends that it be granted.
- 10 (4) This matter came before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on June 13, 2024.
- 11 (5) After review of the Port's request received on February 23, 2024, and giving consideration to all relevant matters and for good cause shown, the Commission grants the request.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 12 (1) The Commission rescinds the approval in Order 01 for the Port of Moses Lake to construct a public highway-rail grade crossing at Randolph Road in the vicinity of Moses Lake, Grant County.
- 13 (2) If the Port of Moses Lake wishes to construct a public highway-rail crossing in the future, it must submit a new petition for Commission approval.

The Commissioners, having determined this Order to be consistent with the public interest, directed the Secretary to enter this Order.
