DECLARATION OF TINA LEIPSKI

I, TINA LEIPSKI, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Washington, declares as follows:

- 1. I am over 18 years of age, a citizen of the United States, a resident of the state of Washington, and competent to be a witness.
- 2. I am employed by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) as a Transportation Specialist 3 in the Licensing Services Section. I have been employed at the Commission for 9 years as a Transportation Specialist. As a Transportation Specialist, my responsibilities include but not limited to reviewing regulated applications for authority, making sure companies maintain insurance, answering questions regarding regulated industries via phone, email or correspondence.
- 3. On March 1, 2010, Daniel Azar, on behalf of Ryan's Express Motorcoach d/b/a Ryan's Express Motorcoach a California Corporation (Ryan's Express) filed with the Commission an Application for Mitigation (Mitigation Request), in Docket TE-100276. I have read the Mitigation Request. In the Mitigation Request, Ryan's Express admits the violation occurred and requests a decision by an administrative law judge.
- 4. This Mitigation Request arises from a Notice of Penalties Incurred and Due for Violations of Laws and Rules issued by the Commission on February 19, 2010, in Docket TE-100276. In that Notice, the Commission issued a penalty of \$100 for a violation of Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-30-071, which requires charter and excursion carriers to file annual safety reports with the Commission by December 31 each year.
- 5. When I spoke to Mr. Azar in January 20, 2010, he informed me that they no longer had their contract but they wanted to keep their certificate active. I advised Mr. Azar that the only way we can keep an active certificate is if they keep current insurance on file. He said he would do that just in case they get more work in

Washington state. I never mentioned the annual report because they were due in December and it never occurred to me that his company might not have submitted the report in a timely manner. Also, annual report inquiries aren't routinely handled by my section or myself.

Charter and Excursion Carriers Staff Investigation - 2009 Annual Safety Reports February 8, 2010

Purpose

The purpose of this investigation is to determine if 14 charter and excursion carriers are in violation of Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-30-071. WAC 480-30-071 requires charter and excursion carriers to furnish annual safety reports to the commission no later than December 31 each year.

Background

This investigation was prompted by commission staff's yearly review of annual safety reports for charter and excursion carriers registered in the state of Washington.

On November 3, 2009, the commission mailed 2009 Annual Safety Report forms and 2010 Regulatory Fee packets to charter and excursion carriers registered in Washington State. A letter from Executive Director and Secretary David W. Danner instructed companies to file annual safety reports and pay regulatory fees by December 31, 2009². Further, the letter stated failure to file the annual safety report by December 31 would result in a penalty and possible cancellation of the company's permit to operate in Washington. Those companies wishing to request an extension to file the annual safety report were asked to do so prior to December 31, providing a reason for the requested extension.

Investigation

The 14 charter and excursion carriers listed in attached Appendix A failed to file their 2009 annual safety reports by the December 31 deadline. On January 15, 2010, the commission sent letters to those companies that had not yet filed their reports. The letter, signed by David W. Danner, gave an extension to companies to file their reports by January 29, 2010³. In the letter, Mr. Danner stated the commission would not seek to penalize any company with a report received postmarked by January 29, 2010. None of the 16 companies listed in Appendix A requested an extension.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends the commission penalize the 14 charter and excursion carriers that failed to file a 2009 annual safety report by January 29, 2010, \$100 each for a violation of WAC 480-30-071.

APPENDIX B

Subject: Your Charter and Excursion Annual Safety Report and Regulatory Fees are Due December 31, 2009

You are required to file an annual safety report and pay regulatory fees if you operate as a charter or excursion company.

What is required of me?

By December 31, you must:

- Complete and file the enclosed 2009 annual safety report form.
- · Pay your 2010 regulatory fees.

If you are using U.S. postal mail to send your annual safety report and pay your regulatory fee, the envelope must be postmarked by Tuesday, December 29, 2008. If you are planning on using another delivery method, the company must ensure that it arrives at the commission by 5:00 p.m. Thursday, December 31, 2009.

Failure to file or mail your annual safety report or pay regulatory fees by December 31, 2009 will result in a penalty and possible cancellation of your permit to operate in Washington. This is the only notice you will receive from the commission.

What happens if I do not pay my regulatory fees by December 31?

If regulatory fees are not paid by December 31, you will incur:

- a 2 percent penalty on the amount due; and
- a 1 percent monthly interest charge on the unpaid balance.

Can I request an extension of time if I am unable to file the annual safety report by December 31?

Yes, you must provide the request in writing, including a valid reason for the extension by December 31. We will notify you when your request is approved or denied. You will still be liable for penalty and interest payments if you fail to pay your regulatory fees by December 31. If you are late filing your annual safety report or fail to file, you could incur additional penalties up to \$100 a day.

What if I didn't operate during the year?

You must indicate this on the report and regulatory fee sheet that you've had no operations, include the minimum \$25 fee and return both forms to the commission. If you are no longer using your charter or excursion authority and wish to cancel it, go to our website at www.utc.wa.gov and locate the, "voluntary permit cancellation form" or call us at (360) 664-1222 and we'll mail you the form.

Subject: Charter and Excursion Annual Safety Report and Regulatory Fees

On November 2, 2009, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission mailed you a safety report and regulatory fee calculation form. The safety report and fees were due by December 31, 2009.

Our records indicate that we have not received your completed safety report or regulatory fees for 2010.

You have already incurred a penalty of 2 percent of the total amount due for failure to pay your 2010 regulatory fees by December 31, 2009. You will be charged 1 percent interest per month on the balance until it is paid in full.

Commission staff may recommend enforcement action, which includes penalties of up to \$100 per day, against any company that does not file a completed safety report. To avoid this potential enforcement action, the commission must receive your safety report postmarked no later than January 29, 2010.
