BACKGROUND

- On October 28, 2015, Ada-Lin Waste Systems, Inc. dba Sunshine Disposal & Recycling (Sunshine Disposal or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) revisions to Tariff 5.1 to recover the increased cost of disposal fees. On November 19, 2015, the Company filed revised pages. The Company serves approximately 370 customers in Spokane County. The Company's last general rate increase became effective on January 1, 2015.
- In order to comply with Spokane County's solid waste plan, the Company changed its disposal site from Sunshine Disposal & Recycling Transfer Station to the Spokane Waste to Energy Plant. The current, embedded disposal rate in the Company's tariff at Sunshine Disposal & Recycling Transfer Station is \$94.75 per ton. On January 1, 2015, the City of Spokane will increase disposal fees at the Spokane Waste to Energy Plant from \$102.39 per ton to \$105.36 per ton. Staff's analysis shows that the Company's proposed rate increase to recover these increased fees would generate approximately \$2,900 (2.9 percent) additional annual revenue and become effective January 1, 2016.
- A disposal fee increase falls within the definition of a general rate increase pursuant to WAC 480-07-505. WAC 480-07-520 lists the minimum required information the Company must provide in a general rate increase filing. The Company provided information pertinent to the disposal fee increase but did not provide the remainder of the information required by the rule and requested an exemption from the work paper filing requirements of WAC 480-07-520(4).

- WAC 480-07-110 allows the Commission to grant an exemption from or modify the application of its rules if consistent with the public interest, the purposes underlying regulation, and applicable statutes. See also WAC 480-70-051.
- Commission Staff reviewed the proposed tariff request together with other factors and recommends the Commission allow the tariff to become effective by operation of law, and grant the Company an exemption from WAC 480-07-520(4), work paper filing requirements for this filing for the following reasons:
 - (a) There have not been any significant changes since the last rate case that became effective on January 1, 2015. Reviewing the rate case documents, customer numbers are relatively unchanged, inflation has been low, and the Company has not changed its collection methods.
 - (b) The increased disposal fees are set by Spokane Waste to Energy Plant and are required as a part of the Company's operations.
 - (c) The Company's financial information supports the proposed revenue requirement and the proposed rates.
 - (d) Staff concluded the proposed rate increase, by reason of the increase in disposal fees, is fair, just, and reasonable.

DISCUSSION

The Commission concurs with Staff's recommendation. The purpose of the work paper filing requirements in WAC 480-07-520(4) is to provide the Commission with information to determine whether a proposed rate increase is fair, just, reasonable, and sufficient. Here, the Company has provided sufficient information to enable the Commission to make that determination, and providing the additional information the rule requires would be unnecessary and unduly burdensome. Accordingly, an exemption from this requirement for purposes of the filing in this docket is consistent with the public interest and the purposes underlying the rule and should be granted.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- 7 (1) The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate the rates, rules, regulations, practices, and accounts of public service companies, including solid waste companies.
- 8 (2) Sunshine Disposal is engaged in the business of providing solid waste services within the state of Washington and is a public service company subject to Commission jurisdiction.
- 9 (3) Sunshine Disposal is subject to the filing requirements of WAC 480-07-520, for general rate increase proposals. The Company requested an exemption from WAC 480-07-520(4) and did not file the work papers required by WAC 480-07-520(4).
- 10 (4) This matter came before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on December 17, 2015.
- An exemption from the general rate increase filing requirements set forth in WAC 480-07-520(4) for the filing in this docket is in the public interest and is consistent with the purposes underlying the regulation and applicable statutes and should be granted.
- It is in the public interest to allow the revisions to Tariff 5.1 filed on October 28, 2015, and revised on November 19, 2015, to become effective on January 1, 2016, by operation of law.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION GRANTS Ada-Lin Waste Systems, Inc. dba Sunshine Disposal & Recycling's request for an exemption from WAC 480-07-520(4), for purposes of the tariff revisions filed in Docket TG-152050 on October 28, 2015, and revised on November 19, 2015.

The Commissioners, having determined this Order to be consistent with the public interest, directed the Secretary to enter this Order.
