Dear Mr. King:

Our Company has been notified by the City of Port Angeles that the tipping fee in Clallam County will increase from \$147.31 to \$155.82 per ton, a 5.8% increase, per Ordinance No. 3243, page 5, Section 2, 13.57.020 Rates, attached. This will increase revenue and expense for the residential customers by \$48,400 (2.1%); commercial customers by \$28,600 (2.7%); and drop box service by \$36,900 (5.8%) for a 12-month period. There are approximately 8,080 residential, 730 commercial and 45 drop box customers affected by this change.

Our Company was also notified by Jefferson County that the tipping fee in Jefferson County will increase from \$142.48 to \$146.04 per ton, a 2.5% increase, per Ordinance No. 06-1125-13, page 5, Fee Indexing, attached. This will increase revenue and expense for the residential customers by \$6,000 (.93%); commercial customers by \$8,000 (1.2%); and drop box service by \$3,900 (2.5%) for a 12-month period. There are approximately 2,700 residential, 500 commercial and 30 drop box customers affected by this change.

The last general rate increase for Olympic Disposal was approved by the Commission, June 1, 2011.

As instructed by the UTC staff during the audit of TG-132227 and TG-132228 these audited calculations have been updated with the increase in tipping fees, no changes to tonnage or customer count have been made.

Attached are revised pages as well as supporting documentation to justify this increase. If these rates are approved by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission they will become effective January 1, 2016. Pursuant to WAC 480-70-271(2) (iii), affected customers will receive notification of the change on the first billing reflecting the revision to rates.

We also request that the Commission, on its own Motion under WAC 480-07-370 (b), allow this disposal fee filing as an exception to the general rate case workpaper rule at WAC 480-07-520.

City Council amended Ordinance No. 3507 regarding the tipping fees at the Blue Mountain Drop Box Facility on November 26<sup>th</sup>, 2014. I have attached a copy of Ordinance No. 3519 showing the revised Blue Mountain Drop Box Facility tipping fees.

The 2016 fees for the Port Angeles Transfer Station and Blue Mountain Drop Box Facility will go into effect January 1, 2016. Per RCW 70.95.212 the City of Port Angeles is meeting the 75 day notice requirement.

ORDINANCE NO. 3519

AN ORDINANCE of the City of Port Angeles, Washington, relating to garbage collection rates, making changes to Title 13, Chapter 13.57 of the Port Angeles Municipal Code.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ANGELES DO HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Ordinance No. 3243 as amended, and Port Angeles Municipal Code Chapter 13.57, is amended to read as follows:

**13.57.020 Rates.**

....

D. All self-haulers shall be charged and shall pay the following rates per ton at the Blue Mountain drop-box:

1. ~~\$237.40~~ The rate shown in the following table per ton for municipal solid waste, provided that the ~~with a \$5.00 minimum charge to a self-hauler is \$5.00.~~

2. Recyclable materials deposited into the recycling drop-off facility will not be charged a fee. Acceptable household hazardous waste will not be charged a fee.

3. The self-hauler rate shall be reduced by 4.6 percent for the federal government, its agencies and instrumentalities.

**Section 2 - Corrections.** The City Clerk and the codifiers of this ordinance are authorized to make necessary corrections to this ordinance including, but not limited to, the correction of the scrivener's/clerical errors, references, ordinance numbering, section/subsection numbers and any references thereto.

**Section 3 - Severability.** If any provisions of this Ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstances, are held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance, or application of the provisions of the Ordinance to other persons or circumstances, is not affected.


**Section 4 -Effective Date.** This Ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically delegated to the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum. This ordinance shall take effect on January 1, 2015 after passage and publication of an approved summary thereof consisting of the title.

AN ORDINANCE of the City of Port Angeles, Washington, relating to utilities rates, making changes to Title 13, Chapters 13.54 and 13.57 of the Port Angeles Municipal Code.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ANGELES DO HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Ordinance No 3243 as amended, and Title 13 of the Port Angeles Municipal Code Chapter 13.54 is amended to read as follows:

....

13.54.050 Schedule R-01—Residential weekly service.

A. The rate shall be ~~\$32.17~~ per month for one collection of a 90-gallon refuse container per week; and the rate per month for each additional refuse container shall be \$32.17. the rates shown in the following table:

Upon request, a refuse container collection in addition to the weekly collection may be made and a utility service fee shall be charged per occurrence in accordance with PAMC 3.70.010.B.3. If a person does not request every-other-week service in accordance with PAMC 13.54.060.A. the rate specified within this section shall apply.

- B. Upon request a 96-gallon recycling container may be provided and shall be collected every other week. The recycling container and collection of the recycling container shall be provided at no additional charge.
- C. A utility service fee in accordance with PAMC 3.70.010.B.4. shall be charged per container each time the same person at the same service location (1) changes from Schedule R-01 - Residential Weekly Service to Schedule R-02 - Residential Every-Other-Week Service, or (2) requests a recycling container where the recycling service has been voluntarily discontinued or terminated in accordance with 13.54.150.H.

- D. A utility service fee shall not be charged to resume recycling service if the same person at the same service location voluntarily terminates water, wastewater, garbage collection, and recycling services providing that electric service is maintained.

**13.54.060 Schedule R-02—Residential every other week service.**

- A. Upon request the rate shall be ~~\$20.35~~ per month for one collection of a 90-gallon refuse container. ~~And~~ and the rate per month for each additional refuse container shall be ~~\$20.35~~; the rates shown in the following table:

- B. A refuse container set out in accordance with the scheduled date and time for weekly service shall not be collected. Upon request, a refuse container collection in addition to the every other week collection may be made and a utility service fee shall be charged per occurrence in accordance with PAMC 3.70.010.B.3.
- C. Upon request a 96-gallon recycling container may be provided and shall be collected every other week. The recycling container and collection of the recycling container shall be provided at no additional charge.
- D. A utility service fee in accordance with PAMC 3.70.010.B.4 shall be charged per container each time the same person at the same service location (1) changes from Schedule R-02 - Residential Every Other Week Service to Schedule R-01- Residential Weekly Service, or (2) requests a recycling container where the recycling service has been voluntarily discontinued or terminated in accordance with 13.54.150.H; provided, however, this paragraph shall not apply to any changes or requests made during the two weeks beginning six weeks prior to the effective date of any amendments to the rates under Schedule R-01 or Schedule R-02.
- E. A utility service fee shall not be charged to resume recycling service if the same person at the same service location voluntarily terminates water, wastewater, garbage collection, and recycling services providing that electric service is maintained.
- F. Under no circumstances shall the rate for any single dwelling or multiple dwelling be less than the rate specified in this Section, except as allowed by PAMC 13.20

**13.54.070 Schedule R-03—Residential yard waste service.**

- A. Upon request the rate shall be \$8.40 per month per 96-gallon yard waste container for one collection of yard waste every other week during the months of March through November and once per month during the months of December through February shall be the rates shown in the following table. The rate per month for each additional yard waste container shall be \$8.40. as shown in the following table.

The rate shall be \$26.89 per month for one collection of a 90-gallon refuse container per week and semi-weekly collection of a cardboard recycling container shall be the rate shown in the following table. The rate per month for each additional refuse container and for each additional weekly collection of a refuse container shall be \$26.89. the rate shown in the following table. The rate shall be reduced by 4.6 percent for the federal government, its agencies and instrumentalities.

- B. Where approved by the Director, a 300-gallon refuse container may be shared by up to five persons. The Director shall determine the rate charged to each person that shares the use of a 300-gallon refuse container based on each person's waste volume and/or weight and Schedule C-02-Commercial 300-Gallon Service. Under no circumstances shall the rate for any person that shares a 300-gallon refuse container be less than Schedule C-01 - Commercial 90 - Gallon Service. The rate shall be reduced by 4.6 percent for the federal government, its agencies and instrumentalities.
- C. Where a restricted use container is required by the Director, the Director shall determine the rate charged to each person that is assigned a restricted refuse container based on each commercial dwelling's waste volume and/or weight and Schedule C-02-Commercial 300-Gallon Service. Under no circumstances shall the rate for any person that is assigned a restricted refuse container be less than Schedule C-01 -Commercial 90-Gallon Service. The rate shall be reduced by 4.6 percent for the federal government, its agencies and instrumentalities.

**13.54.110 Schedule C-03—Commercial recycling service.**

When the commercial recycling service is requested in addition to semi-weekly collection of cardboard, the rate shall be ~~\$13.80~~ the rate shown in the following table per month for one collection of a recycling container per week for each location within the City limits of Port Angeles. The rate per month for each additional recycling container and each additional weekly collection of a recycling container shall be ~~\$13.80~~ the rate shown in the following table.

5. Collection entities that do not provide the City an exemption certificate in accordance with WAC 458-20-250(7) shall be deemed self-hauler for purposes of determining rates.
- B. All self-haulers shall be charged and shall pay the following rates at the transfer station (except as set forth herein):
1. \$170.11 The rate shown in the following table per ton for municipal solid waste with a \$10.00 minimum fee.

The environmental fee per unit shall be in addition to the rate per ton for metals and white goods.

8. In lieu of requiring multiple scale house transactions for loads with mixed municipal solid waste, the Director may establish weight reductions for recyclable materials, metals, acceptable household hazardous waste, and acceptable moderate-risk waste. Under no circumstances shall a weight reduction result in a reduction of the minimum fee. The weight reductions approved by the Director shall be issued at the scale house.
- C. The self-hauler rate 13.57.020.B.1. may be waived or reduced by up to 50 percent subject to the following requirements:
1. The person requesting a waiver or reduction submits a written application to the Director at least 30 days before disposal of refuse at the transfer station. The Director shall accept or deny the application before refuse is disposed at the transfer station.
  2. A waiver may be available for disposal of refuse which is collected as part of a beautification or cleanup program, such as the annual transfer station benefit dump day, Clallam County chain gang, and Washington State Department of Transportation Adopt a Highway program, which must dispose of litter.
  3. A reduction may be available for disposal of refuse, which is collected as part of the annual City of Sequim benefit dump day.
  4. A reduction may be available to charitable, nonprofit organizations, such as the Salvation Army, St. Vincent DePaul, and Serenity House, the primary purpose of which is provide necessary support for the poor or infirm and which must dispose of unusable donated items.
  5. Pursuant to Chapter 35.83 RCW, a reduction may be applied to the Housing Authority of Clallam County for self-haul of materials left by tenants who vacate housing authority premises and for disposal of demolition debris.
  6. All waivers or reductions approved by the Director shall be valid for 30 days and shall be limited to projects that further the public health, safety, or welfare,

enhances the environment, or is otherwise in the public interest for parties of the interlocal agreement.

7. In order for the waiver or reduction to be valid, applications approved by the Director shall be presented to the scale house attendant at the time of disposal.
- D. All self-haulers shall be charged and shall pay the following rates per ton at the Blue Mountain drop-box:
1. ~~\$237.40~~ The rate shown in the following table per ton for municipal solid waste with a \$5.00 minimum charge.

**Section 3 - Corrections.** The City Clerk and the codifiers of this ordinance are authorized to make necessary corrections to this ordinance including, but not limited to, the correction of the scrivener's/clerical errors, references, ordinance numbering, section/subsection numbers and any references thereto.


**Section 4 - Severability.** If any provisions of this Ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstances, are held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance, or application of the provisions of the Ordinance to other persons or circumstances, is not affected.

**Section 5 -Effective Date.** This Ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically delegated to the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum. This ordinance shall take effect on January 1, 2015 after passage and publication of an approved summary thereof consisting of the title.



*WHEREAS*, Ordinance No. 06-0726-93 was adopted in 1993 to establish per ton and per unit base fees for the Solid Waste Division (Solid Waste) of the Public Works Department, Jefferson County (County); and

*WHEREAS*, Ordinance 12-1209-96 was adopted that, in part (Section 2), amended the solid waste tax of Ordinance 06-93; and

*WHEREAS*, Ordinance 03-0405-04 was adopted to establish fees for the Solid Waste Moderate Risk Waste Facility; and

*WHEREAS*, Ordinance 09-0922-08 was adopted to amend the Jefferson County Code (JCC) section III-020 to add a fee for yard debris delivered to the City of Port Townsend (City) Biosolids Composting Facility, which fee is collected and managed on behalf of the City by the County at the Jefferson County Transfer Station scale-house; and

*WHEREAS*, solid waste base fees have not been increased since their adoption in 1993; and

*WHEREAS*, increased quantity of material disposed through 2006 and operational efficiencies allowed the imposition of higher fees to be postponed; and

*WHEREAS*, solid waste tonnage fell by 17 percent from 2006 to 2011 and has remained at that level, and the consequent reduction in revenue combined with rising costs have required Solid Waste Funds reserves to be drawn down in order to balance annual budgets; and

*WHEREAS*, the Solid Waste Funds balances are now reduced to minimum levels consistent with prudent fiscal guidelines and can no longer be used to balance annual budgets; and

*WHEREAS*, the solid waste community is predicting a slow recovery in the economy with consequent low growth in tonnage disposed, and that revenue growth is therefore likely to lag cost inflation; and

*WHEREAS*, Solid Waste staff (Staff) has completed an analysis of solid waste operations, projected costs and fees; and

*WHEREAS*, Staff presented the findings of that analysis to Port of Port Townsend and County Public Health staff on May 7, 2013; to City staff on May 9, 2013; to the County Solid Waste Advisory Committee (SWAC) on May 23 and June 27, 2013, and to the County Administrator on July 23, 2013 ; and

*WHEREAS*, Staff reviewed the findings of that analysis with the Board of County Commissioners (Board) at a briefing on September 16, 2013 that was open to the public; and

*WHEREAS*, Staff presented the findings of that analysis, recommendations for higher waste disposal fees, and a Draft Ordinance to enact proposed higher fees to the Board during a regularly scheduled and duly noticed Commissioners meeting on Monday, October 21, 2013 and requested a Public Hearing on the proposed fees; and

*WHEREAS*, the Final Ordinance to enact higher fees was presented to the Board for approval and signature at a Public Hearing on November 12, 2013 and that Public Hearing was duly-noticed and open to the public; and

*WHEREAS*, The Department of Public Works has now proposed changes to the Jefferson County Code (JCC) to implement new fee schedules for solid waste collected and managed at the Jefferson County Transfer Station, at the Quilcene Drop Box Site, and at the Moderate Risk Waste Facility, codified at Appendix FEE SCHEDULES, Section III of the JCC; and

*WHEREAS*, No changes are proposed to the fees charged for yard debris delivered to the City Biosolids Composting Facility,

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED* by the Board of County Commissioners of Jefferson County as follows:

SECTION 1. Fee Schedules: The current version of the Jefferson County Code (JCC), Appendix FEE SCHEDULES Section III, is hereby repealed and replaced with the attached version of the JCC, Appendix FEE SCHEDULES, Section III, marked here as Exhibit A.

SECTION 2. Fee Indexing: The portion of the JCC entitled "Appendix ANNUAL FEE INDEXING" is HEREBY AMENDED to read as follows:

*Unless otherwise specified in JCC, Appendix, FEE SCHEDULES, Section III, fixed amount fees established by this appendix shall be adjusted annually on the first business day of January ("adjustment date") by the amount of the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPIW). The CPIW is the Consumer Price Index – U.S. City Average for All Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers, published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics for the United States Department of Labor.*

The annual fee adjustment shall be calculated as follows: Each fee in effect immediately prior to the adjustment date will be increased by the percentage increase in the CPIW between the CPIW reported for the month of September preceding the adjustment date and the CPIW reported for the month of September one year earlier. Increases will be rounded to the nearest dollar. A fee shall not be reduced by reason of such calculation. However, fee increases in accordance with this calculation shall not exceed five percent (5%) per year.



Copies of the adjusted fee schedule shall be available to the public at the office of the designated department and will be mailed to any customer upon request. The adjusted fee schedule will show the prior year fees, the CPIW, and the new fee.

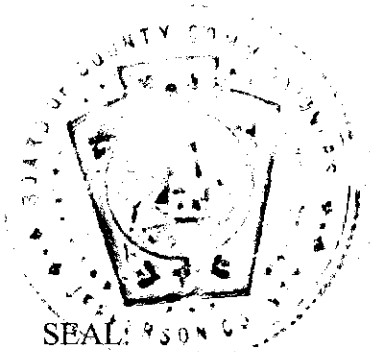
SECTION 3. Repeal: The establishment of revised fee schedules by this Ordinance repeals Ordinance No. 06-0726-93 and Ordinance No. 03-0405-04 in their entireties.

SECTION 4. Severability: If any section, subsection, clause, phrase or figure of this Ordinance or its application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance or the application to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected.

SECTION 5. Effective Date: This Ordinance shall take effect sixty (60) days after adoption by the Board of County Commissioners and publication.

Appendix FEE SCHEDULES [Ord. 13-12]

III. Public Works Department – Solid Waste Division

**III-010 Purpose – Scope.**

The purpose of this section is to establish a fee schedule for the solid waste division of the Jefferson County department of public works. This schedule shall apply to all fees required by the solid waste division.

**III-011 Effective Date**

The fees listed in Sections III-020 through III-050 shall go into effect on the first business day in January 2014 (or sixty days after the enacting Ordinance is adopted and published, if later). Fees will be adjusted annually through 2019 as provided for in Section III-012 of this schedule.

**III-012 Fee Indexing**

The base (pre-tax) solid waste disposal fees established by this Appendix Part III for Public Works Solid Waste Division with the exception of the minimum charge (III-020(4)), environmental fee (III-020(3)) and yard debris fee (III-020(6)) shall be adjusted on the first business day of 2015 and annually thereafter for a period of five (5) years, by a percentage increase of 2.5%. The WA State solid waste collection tax of 3.6% shall be added to the adjusted base fees where applicable.

The percentage increase of 2.5% is calculated to maintain minimum specified reserved balances in the solid waste funds, measured by the following benchmarks:

- A reserved Capital Fund balance at year-end, projected in September of that year, of 12% of then current capital replacement value in equipment and buildings, excluding any GO bond funds, and
- A reserved Operations Fund balance at year-end, projected in September of that year, of 15% of the annual total solid waste expenditures, and
- An increase in the annual waste tons received of no less than 1% per year with 2013 as a base year.

An increase over the annual percentage rate fee increase of 2.5% that is necessary for the Fund reserved balances to meet the stated benchmarks shall be subject to review, approval and adoption by Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners.

Copies of the fee schedule shall be available to the public at the Public Works office and will be mailed to any customer upon request. The adjusted fee schedule will show the prior year fees, the annual percentage increase, and the new fees.

**III-020 Solid Waste Disposal - Transfer Station Commercial and Noncommercial Rates.**

The solid waste collection tax, where applicable, will be added to the base fees as shown below:

Yard debris shall only include grass clippings, leaves, tree branches not over eight to 10 inches in diameter and less than eight feet long, and other plant material, but excluding stumps, kitchen scraps, food waste, dimensional lumber, rocks, gravel, dirt, lawn furniture, tools, or other non-vegetative material. Acceptable yard debris shall be dropped off at a point designated by the City of Port Townsend staff.

In the event the weight scales are inoperative, the rates for the solid waste disposal drop box site listed in Section III-030 shall apply to loose waste and other items; commercial compacted waste shall be charged based on average load weights for each route, determined for the immediately preceding calendar month, and by mutual agreement with the commercial haulers.

The Solid waste disposal transfer station, Drop box site, Moderate risk waste facility and Recycle center hours of operation shall be set by the Director of Public Works with approval by the Board of County Commissioners.

**III-050 Moderate Risk Waste Disposal Facility.**


Tax, where applicable, will be added to the base fees shown below:

- (1) This base fee schedule shall apply to the processing and disposal of moderate risk waste materials brought to the facility by businesses classified as conditionally exempt small quantity generators (CESQGs) in 40 CFR 261.5.
- (2) The base fees include all labor and materials, facility overhead, and shipping and final disposal costs.
- (3) A minimum charge, at the rate shown, will be made when the calculated total fee per customer visit is less than that minimum amount.
- (4) Charges for CESQG waste material types not listed will be charged at a rate determined from the sum of the waste disposal fee (shipping and disposal charge) obtained from the county's disposal contractor plus a processing charge at the hourly rate shown in the table below.
- (5) No fee shall be charged for household hazardous waste obtained from the general public.

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**Statement of Issue:**

A Public Hearing was held by the Board of Commissioners at 11:00 am on Tuesday, November 12, 2013 during which public testimony concerning the proposed Solid Waste Division Fee Ordinance was taken and considered by the Board. Following questions and discussion, the Board directed staff to change the fee ordinance to *exclude the transfer station minimum charge for 2014 from the 2.5% annual fee increases proposed for years 2015 through 2019*, the purpose to mitigate the fee increase and to simplify cash handling at the scales.

The Board also moved and approved that staff reschedule the revised Fee Ordinance on a future Consent Agenda.

**Analysis/Strategic Goals/Pro's & Con's:**

The Solid Waste Enterprise Fund is managed as a business to provide municipal and hazardous waste disposal, recycling services and associated services to County and City of Port Townsend residents. This function is mandated by RCW 36.58 Solid Waste Disposal and RCW 70.95(A-N) Solid Waste Management, Reduction and Recycling. Public Works currently provides a level of service that implements the regulatory requirements, supported by the Jefferson County Solid Waste Management Plan, and is available to all citizens of Jefferson County.

**Fiscal Impact/Cost Benefit Analysis:**

The Solid Waste Disposal Fees that were enacted in 1993 and 2004 are no longer sufficient to cover the costs of providing the defined level of service. Solid Waste Fund reserves have been reduced to minimum fiscally responsible levels. The proposed fee schedules for 2014 will enable revenues to pay for anticipated operating costs and continue current services. An annual percentage increase in specified fees through 2019 is proposed to keep pace with projected cost inflation and will also contribute to essential capital facilities refurbishing and replacement. Benchmarks are proposed to allow actual and projected Fund performance to be monitored.


**Recommendation:**

Public Works requests the Board to review the changes made to the proposed Ordinance following the Board's direction, and to enact the proposed Ordinance and fee schedules as presented.
