 Northwest Railway Musuem

Between Oct. 24 and Dec. 4, 2019, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission awarded three GCPF grants totaling \$17,463.00 to the Northwest Railway Musuem (Musuem) for projects related to replacement and upgrading of batteries and/or train detection equipment at the trespass abatement gate and crossings listed in the table below. The actual cost of the projects was \$13,227.83.
