Recommendation

Take no action, allowing the tariff revisions and rates, filed on November 14, 2019, as revised on December 11, 2019, to go into effect January 1, 2020, by operation of law.

Discussion

On November 14, 2019, Company Seventy-Nine d/b/a Red Mountain Water Association (Red Mountain or company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission) a general rate increase. The proposed increase would generate approximately \$2,484 (4 percent) additional annual revenue.

Red Mountain serves 85 customers in Benton County. Their last rate increase went into effect October 1, 2019, for \$8,136. Red Mountain is filing this follow-up general rate increase due to discovery of miscalculations of federal income taxes and a contributed asset amortization. Additionally, the company is also seeking to increase several ancillary charges that reflect more current costs.

Commission staff's (staff) review of documentation provided by the company found justification of an increase of \$1,792 (2.6 percent) additional annual revenue. In the previous rate case, staff's review indicated the Block 3 usage rate needed to be increased to encourage water conservation. So, in this filing staff accepts the company proposed increase to Block 3 usage rate, increasing it from \$1.15 per thousand gallons to \$1.23 per thousand gallons.

The revised rate increases will not affect the average customer using 35,934 gallons per month, which is approximately the middle of Block 2.

Staff finds the rates for Block 3 are not set to encourage substantial conservation, but will examine this in the next filing, after customers have adjusted to the usage blocks set in this and the prior filing.

Staff's review of the proposed increases to ancillary charges found the company provided adequate support to justify increasing the service connection and late payment charges. The changes bring these charges in line with actual company costs.

Documentation from the company's banking institution did not support the company's proposed increase for non-sufficient funds (NSF) check charges. The company agreed to retain the current tariff rate.
