The Public Counsel Unit of the Washington State Attorney General's Office ("Public Counsel") respectfully submits these comments in response to the Commission's Notice of Opportunity to File Comments, issued on April 13, 2021. On February 3, 2021, several non-governmental organizations ("NGOs") jointly submitted a letter requesting the Commission initiate a proceeding to investigate Colstrip's ongoing expenses resulting in a clear order or determination from the Commission that continued funding to maintain and operate Colstrip is not consistent with prudent utility practice.

Colstrip is undoubtedly a complicated issue. Public Counsel views it as one that will continue to pose challenges for our regulated electric companies and the ratepayers they serve. We would support opening a proceeding to look at the issues posed by Colstrip in a holistic manner, and would participate in such a proceeding if the Commission chooses to commence one.
