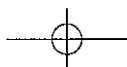

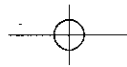

We are attentive to donors' particular interests.

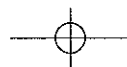

Our Founding Story

The Greater Everett Community Foundation began in 1993 as the Everett Parks Foundation, and expanded its mission in 2001 to become a Community Foundation. Our historical work in Everett's parks provided crucial experience in community building that is fundamental to the work of community foundations, and led us to where we are today. We continue to learn about the best practices of the 550 community foundations that exist across the country, and to implement those practices in our own organization.

As a first step in our expansion, the board committed to raise an operational endowment to assure our permanence. Recognizing that an important element in community is unity, the Vada Newland Family, Phil Johnson, John and Idamae Schack, Grace Bargreen Family, Nysether Family Foundation, Roy and Ann Thorsen Family, Don and Joyce Tisdell Family and Harry and Jeanne Metzger Family, joined together to begin a new chapter in Snohomish County's history. These eight founders collectively contributed \$2 million to create the Greater Everett Community Foundation Operational Endowment Fund.

The prosperity of a community is anchored in its people—how they care, what they do, and how much they support one another. The founding families of the Greater Everett Community Foundation share much in common. Above all, they believe that Snohomish County is a wonderful place that they want to see grow and prosper for years to come. As a result of their generosity and vision, the Greater Everett Community Foundation will be here forever, serving people throughout Snohomish County.

Our Founders, and the many individuals, businesses, and organizations that have supported our work over the years, are the cornerstones of the Greater Everett Community Foundation. They exemplify the fundamental values that will always guide us: community spirit, hard work, innovation, and a sense of optimism about the future.





Our Eighth Founder

Harry and Jeanne Metzger and their four daughters Jan, Jo, Meg and Maddy, hold and live by a family value that has come down to them over the years—to help others and do what you can to give back to the community. They are proud to be the Eighth Founder of the Greater Everett Community Foundation, thus completing the founding campaign.

The Metzgers' history in our area began in Everett in 1890 when Eugene M. Metzger started a grocery store in a building still standing at Hewitt and Maple Streets. The store gave many families a helping hand through the hard

times in Everett's early pioneer days. E. M. later went into the real estate business, and with his wife Della established strong roots in the community. Their son, Harry L. Metzger, owned an insurance, real estate and property management business located in Everett's Central Building. Harry and his wife Madeleine raised their children in north Everett.

Third generation Harry B. Metzger joined his father in the business and eventually bought it. He later sold the business, which enabled him to enjoy 14 years of driving a school bus for the Everett School District. Jeanne Metzger spent many years as

a writer and editor at The (Everett) Herald. Now retired, she volunteers her time with state and local hospice organizations.

The four Metzger daughters all live in Washington State and are active in their respective communities. Harry and Jeanne hope that the fifth generation of Metzgers—their seven grandchildren—will carry forward the family legacy by enthusiastically serving their communities in their own ways, wherever they might live.

Grants in Action

The Human Services Fund in Honor of Bob Drewel was established with proceeds from the Foundation's 2003 Possibilities Breakfast plus a pledge from United Way of Snohomish County. This fund is permanently endowed and will annually provide grants, from the earnings on the Endowment, to assist human services agencies throughout Snohomish County.

In 2005, we were able to give our first grants from this fund, totaling \$10,000, to the following five organizations:

Vial of Life Program—American Red Cross

The Vial of Life program serves as an easy way of providing emergency responders with life-saving personal medical information during a response call, allowing them to give safer and more efficient treatment. Medical information including illness, prescriptions & allergies is stored in a 6" clear plastic tube in the refrigerator. A Vial of Life magnet then goes on the outside of the fridge to inform emergency responders that the individual has a vial present. The grant from the Greater Everett Community Foundation will allow the American Red Cross to distribute 2,000 vials free of charge through Senior Services of Snohomish County.

Operation School Bell—Assistance League of Everett

Operation School Bell works with 14 Snohomish County school districts to provide low income children with new school clothing, including winter coat, hat, gloves, shirts, pants, underwear, a hygiene kit, and voucher for new shoes. The children select the outfits they like and will wear which helps them to feel better about themselves. The grant will allow 25 children to start school this fall with new clothes as well as clothes to keep them warm this winter.

Preventing Homelessness—Bridgeways

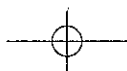
This project responds to an urgent community need. Due to changes in both federal and state funding policies, mentally ill individuals who re-enter our community from hospitalization find themselves without transitional resources until they become eligible for Medicaid assistance. Homelessness often results in this period of time, because individuals cannot pay rent, buy food or otherwise care for themselves. The grant from the Human Services Fund will establish and staff three beds at the Bridgeways' facility to support clients while case managers find permanent housing for them.

Moving from Shelter into Self Sufficiency Program—Snohomish County Center for Battered Women

The goal of this program is to establish domestic violence victims and their children in safe affordable housing, and provide resources necessary to move the family into housing. For domestic violence victims, making the decision to remove themselves from an abusive relationship can be the most difficult choice of their life. To leave their home, their belongings, and their friends/family is a decision wrought with fear and anxiety. The Greater Everett Community Foundation hopes to ease some of that anxiety by paying for moving expenses for 20 families.

Beds for Children Program—Society of St. Vincent de Paul

Trained volunteers travel to the client's residence to provide immediate solutions to critical concerns like food, shelter, utilities or medical care. During these visits, volunteers may observe that the children in the family have no beds. The Beds for Children program provides a store voucher redeemable for bed frame, mattress and box springs, pillow, sheets, and a blanket, and also delivery, if needed. This grant will allow 26 kids in Snohomish County to receive beds.

Ways to Give

Giving through the Greater Everett Community Foundation is simple, flexible and responsive to donors' needs. It empowers lifelong community involvement. Most donors give through us by creating a fund held at the Foundation. The following options are representative of the continuum of choices available to our donors:

Community Fund – Recognizing that needs and organizations change, the donor entrusts the foundation to select the most promising and urgent community programs to receive support, both now and in the future.

Field of Interest Fund – These funds support a particular area of interest such as education, the arts or human services. The Foundation awards the grants, based on competitive application processes, to the most appropriate program within the field of interest specified.

Donor Advised Fund – An opportunity for those who prefer to actively recommend distributions from the fund they create.

Designated Fund – The donor creates a fund to permanently support one or more named organizations.

Agency Endowment Fund – A nonprofit organization transfers assets to establish an endowment for the ongoing support of their agency, thus benefiting from the Foundation's administrative and investment management.

The Foundation's Operating Fund – Gifts to the Foundation's own Operating Fund support the day-to-day work of the Foundation.

The Foundation's Endowment Fund – Gifts to our Endowment Fund provide a source of income to cover operating expenses for years to come, ensuring the Foundation's ongoing capacity to serve the community in perpetuity.
