# NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO FILE WRITTEN COMMENTS ON PROPOSED RULES (By October 1, 2020)

and

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE VIRTUAL ADOPTION HEARING (Set for November 6, 2020, at 9:30 a.m.)

Re: Rulemaking to amend the Energy Independence Act (EIA) WAC 480-109, Docket UE-190652

#### TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

This notice is to inform interested persons of the progress made in this rulemaking docket concerning possible adoption of proposed revisions to the rules governing implementation of the Energy Independence Act (EIA). The commission also provides notice of an opportunity to file written comments on the proposed rule amendments and notice of the formal rule adoption hearing scheduled for November 6, 2020, at 9:30 a.m.

On October 4, 2019, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) filed with the Code Reviser a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) to consider whether the Commission's rules related to the EIA, codified at Chapter 19.285 RCW, require revision to comply with new statutory requirements. The Commission filed the CR-101 under Docket UE-190652. The Commission conducted a workshop on January 28, 2020, and solicited comments on draft rules. The Commission also issued a Small Business Economic Impact Statement Questionnaire on January 16, 2020, to obtain information regarding the impact of the draft rules on the companies. On March 27, 2020, the Commission filed a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (CR-102) with the Office of the Code Reviser, along with a Notice of Opportunity to File Written Comments on Proposed Rules and a Notice of Proposed Rule Adoption Hearing.

In response to these notices, the Commission received comments from stakeholders, some of whom requested a substantive edit to the rules. As a result, the Commission withdrew the CR-102 on May 27, 2020, to make edits to the proposed rules.

On June 4, 2020, the Commission filed a revised Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (CR-102) with the Office of the Code Reviser. On July 28, 2020, the Commission held an adoption hearing in this rulemaking. After the adoption hearing, the Commission determined to make an additional substantive edit to the proposed rules. As a result, the Commission withdrew the CR-102 on August 31, 2020, to make this edit to the proposed rules.

The proposed change involves deleting WAC 480-109-200(2)(a). This proposed deletion does not alter the requirement that electric utilities have adequate eligible renewable resources or equivalent renewable energy credits (RECs) under contract to meet their annual targets by January 1 of the target year, as required by RCW 19.285.040(2). Rather, the proposed deletion clarifies existing practice that allows utilities to buy RECs after January 1 if they find they have additional need, or if cheaper options become available to use in place of those acquired by January 1. The Commission believes the proposed edit eliminates confusion and provides more clarity for all stakeholders.

On August 31, 2020, the Commission filed a revised Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (CR-102) with the Office of the Code Reviser. The proposed rules amend sections of chapter 480-109 WAC. The Commission has reviewed the comments received from stakeholders to date in this docket and has prepared proposed rules for review and comment by interested persons. The proposed rules are available for inspection on the Commission's web page at <a href="http://www.utc.wa.gov/190652">http://www.utc.wa.gov/190652</a>. The CR-102 filing initiates the final part of the rulemaking process, which includes a written comment period, a public adoption hearing, and a decision by the Commission.

#### WRITTEN COMMENTS

The Commission gives notice of your opportunity to submit written comments on the proposed rules. Written comments must be filed with the Commission no later than **5 p.m.**, **October 1**, **2020**. Pursuant to WAC 480-07-250(3), written comments must be submitted in electronic form, specifically in searchable .pdf format (Adobe Acrobat or comparable software). As provided in WAC 480-07-140(5), those comments must be submitted via the Commission's web portal at <a href="www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing">www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing</a>.
