This filing is in response to the Commission's direction in Docket Nos.  
UE-901183-T and UE-901184-P to "make a rate design filing no later than April  
1992." (Third Supplemental Order, p. 24; Ordering Paragraph No. 6, p. 32.)

By this letter, the Company requests waiver of the requirements of WAC 480-09-300  
through -330 pertaining to general rate increases. The enclosed filing does not  
propose to increase the gross annual revenue of the Company, but rather is in  
response to a specific Commission directive.

The proposed tariffs included with this filing provide for an effective date of  
May 31, 1992, or thirty days after the date of this filing. The Company antici-  
pates that the Commission will suspend the proposed tariffs and commence an  
investigation. In suspending these tariffs, the Commission should be aware that


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the Company may file a general rate case in the fall of 1992, in accordance with the Commission's requirement that the Company make a general rate filing every three years (Docket Nos. UE-901183-T and UE-901184-P, Third Supplemental Order, Ordering Paragraph No. 4). Such a general rate filing would involve the same rate schedules that would be under suspension in this proceeding. The Company's submittal of proposed tariffs in this proceeding is with the express understanding that it will be permitted to submit revised sheets with its general rate filing. The Company requests that the Commission, in its order suspending tariffs in this proceeding, grant authorization for the Company to submit additional revisions to such tariffs in connection with the Company's general rate filing.

It should be noted that this filing includes a number of new rate schedules which are unaffected by the filing of a general rate case. Implementation of these proposed tariffs -- Schedules 6, 30, 36, 38, 39 and 48 -- need not be postponed to coordinate with the tariff changes affected by the general rate case filing. In fact, because these rate schedules are experimental provisions offered on a limited basis, it would be preferable to have these new rate schedules take effect in advance of general rate changes to allow the Company to gather as much experience as possible under the proposals.

The tariff sheet described herein reflects an issue date of April 30, 1992, and an effective date of May 31, 1992. Notice of the proposed tariff changes, as required by law and the Commission's rules and regulations, is being given to the public immediately prior to or coincident with the date of this transmittal letter. Enclosed are posting forms 1 and 2.
