Response:

The "65 percent of Puget Sound Energy's ("PSE") population" represent those accounts, both residential and commercial, with an internal "good" credit worthiness designation, that have not received more than six delinquency notices within the last twelve months.

The reference in the Prefiled Testimony of Ahmad Faruqui, Exhibit AF-1T represents data extracted from PSE's existing Customer Information System detailing total contract account counts based on established internal credit worthiness ratings associated to customers' bill payment history with PSE.
