Charter designs and builds its networks to remain functional in emergency situations, including by (1) having a reasonable amount of back-up power to ensure functionality without an external power source; (2) rerouting traffic around damaged facilities; and (3) managing traffic spikes resulting from emergency situations. These practices apply to Charter's broadband and voice services.

#### Explanation:

Charter has been providing voice and/or broadband internet access services to customers on a 24/7/365 basis for almost twenty years. As part of providing these services, it is necessary to have in place contingency plans for emergency situations for each of Charter's major network hubs and/or facilities that are geographically distributed across the United States. These plans contain activation, staffing, escalation, and communication procedures to identify and respond to such emergencies. Additionally, all switching facilities are equipped with independent power generators and sufficient fuel to operate for several days to mitigate commercial power outages. The design of these facilities contains multiple levels of redundancy and autonomy that also mitigate the need for dedicated human interaction. Charter is designing and building its RDOF facilities consistent with these established practices.

Spectrum Southeast, LLC Spectrum Sunshine State, LLC Charter's standalone residential fixed voice service in these areas is its Spectrum Voice product, which is currently priced at \$29.99 and expected to remain priced below \$55.13 for calendar year 2024 with all taxes and fees included in the price. Charter's standalone small business fixed voice service in these areas is its Spectrum Business Voice product, which is currently priced at \$49.99 and expected to remain priced below \$55.13 for calendar year 2024 with all taxes and fees included in the price. Both are below the FCC's reasonable comparability benchmark for fixed voice service in 2024, which is \$55.13.

The pricing of Charter's RDOF broadband residential and small and medium business ("SMB") products were no more than the non-promotional price charged for comparable fixed wireline residential and SMB products in urban areas in each of the states where Charter received support during calendar year 2023.

Charter utilizes a standardized pricing model across its 41-state footprint. Under this standardized pricing model, the pricing of Charter's broadband services is the same across urban areas and rural areas, including RDOF areas.

The non-promotional price of Charter's broadband product for residential customers that meets the FCC's broadband obligations for RDOF support recipients was \$119.99 between January 1, 2023, and August 8, 2023, and \$124.99 between August 9, 2023, and December 31, 2023, nationally.

Throughout calendar year 2023, the non-promotional price of Charter's small and medium business ("SMB") broadband product that meets the Commission's broadband obligations for RDOF support recipients was \$299.99 nationally.

In RDOF areas, Charter provides a 1G x 1G residential and a 1G x 1G SMB service (previously 1000/500 Mbps for each service), each with unlimited data, that meets the Commission's broadband obligations for RDOF support recipients via newly constructed fiber optic cable. Charter is making this offering available upon activating its RDOF facilities, which Charter is in the process of deploying. In urban areas, the comparable products may have a lower upstream speed of 1G x 35 Mbps but are offered for the same non-promotional price and subject to the same terms and conditions as the 1G x 1G (previously 1000/500 Mbps) services offered in RDOF areas.

Accordingly, Charter's broadband services meet the Commission's broadband public interest obligation for RDOF support with respect to the reasonable rate comparability standard, because those services are:

- 1) priced at no more than the applicable non-promotional price that Charter charges for a comparable fixed wireline service in urban areas in the states where Charter receives support; and
- (2) subject to the same terms and conditions in both urban and rural areas.
