Dear Judge Rendahl:

Attached to this letter is WorldCom's supplement to the draft Exhibit List that you circulated earlier. This identifies WorldCom's Comments filed last week on Qwest's performance data and the exhibit attached to those comments. Of course, whether they will be introduced as exhibits next week depends upon whether the hearing will address Qwest's performance data.

This is also responds to your request that the parties identify witnesses, direct examination time and cross examination time. WorldCom assumes that the discussions on the Performance Assurance Plan (PAP), the Commission's Questions to the parties and Comments on the Bench Requests will all be handled through oral argument rather than witness testimony. If that is not the case, Chad Warner will present testimony supporting WorldCom's Comments on those matters. His direct testimony on those matters will take approximately 1 hour.

If the Commission decides that performance data will be discussed at the hearing, Mr. Warner also intends to present testimony supporting WorldCom's Comments on Qwest's Performance Data. Mr. Warner's direct testimony on Qwest's performance data will take approximately 1/2 hour.

My cross examination estimations also assume that the discussions on the PAP, the Commission's Questions and the Bench Requests will be through oral argument rather than testimony. I expect approximately 1/2 hour of cross examination on the SGAT's compliance with Commission Orders and, if it is addressed, approximately 1 hour of cross examination on Qwest's performance data.
