ORDER 01

GRANTING APPLICATION

To Amend its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Operate a Gas Plant for Hire in the Goldendale, Washington Area Within Klickitat County

BACKGROUND

- On February 23, 2021, consistent with the requirements of RCW 80.28.190, Avista Corporation, d/b/a Avista Utilities, (Avista or Company) filed an application to amend its present Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Operate a Gas Plant for Hire (Application).
- Avista is presently certificated for and is now providing gas service in Klickitat County. Avista is requesting a certificate to expand the service area in unincorporated Klickitat County near Goldendale, Washington, an unincorporated community. The additional area requested is contiguous to the existing certificated area and do not overlap with certificated areas of another utility.
- The Application requests no determination at this time about the reasonableness of the gas pipeline facility servicing this addition to Avista's service area.
- Commission staff (Staff) reviewed the Company's filing and believes that Avista is best suited to serve the requested service territory economically. No other gas provider is currently serving in this area.

DISCUSSION

- We agree with Staff's recommendation. RCW 80.28.190 gives the Commission authority to grant certificates of necessity and convivence to gas companies that we find are operating in good faith and within the confines of the area for which such certificate shall be sought.
- We find that Avista is economically best situated to serve the requested service territory because no other gas provider is currently serving in this area. Accordingly, the Application should be granted to satisfy the public convenience and necessity.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- 7 (1) The Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate rates, rules, regulations, practices, accounts, securities, and transfers of public service companies, including gas companies.
- 8 (2) Avista is a gas company and is a public service company subject Commission jurisdiction.
- 9 (3) RCW 80.28.190 states no gas company shall operate in this state any gas plant for hire without first having obtained from the Commission a certificate declaring that public convenience and necessity requires or will require such operation and setting forth the area or areas within which service is to be rendered.
- 10 (4) Avista has previously been issued a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate a gas plant for hire.
- 11 (5) Avista has filed an Application to amend its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to include an additional area in Klickitat County. This area is contiguous to Avista's presently certificated area.
- 12 (6) Staff has reviewed the Company's Application and recommends approval of the application to amend its certificate to include the additional area requested.
- This matter was brought before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on December 23, 2021.

14 (8) After review of the request filed by Avista and giving due consideration, the Commission finds it is consistent with the public convenience and necessity that the Certificate of Avista be amended to reflect the addition of areas in the Goldendale, Washington area, located in Klickitat County.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- The application of Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities to amend its
 Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Operate a Gas Plant for Hire
 within the certificated area in Klickitat County is granted and the Certificate shall
 be amended in accordance with the legal description provided in the supplemental
 information filed on February 23, 2021, in Exhibit B.
- This Order makes no determination at this time as to the reasonableness of the gas pipeline facility to serve this addition to Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities' service area and recognizes the right of the Commission to determine such reasonable services and expenditures, together with treatment of same, in any formal proceeding before the Commission dealing with Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities' results of operations for ratemaking purposes.
- The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities to effectuate the provisions of this Order.

The Commissioners, having determined this Order to be consistent with the public interest, directed the Executive Secretary to enter this Order.
