NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket No. TR-041066 is an application by Chelan County, Washington for upgrade of the Chestnut Street railroad crossing of the Cascade and Columbia River Railroad (Cascade and Columbia or the railroad) in Chelan Falls, Washington. Docket No. TR-041076 is an application by the railroad for closure of the A street railroad crossing in Chelan Falls, Washington.

- 2 **CONFERENCE.** The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in these dockets at Olympia, Washington on January 10, 2005 before Administrative Law Judge Theodora M. Mace.
- APPEARANCES. Louis Chernak, attorney, Wenatchee, Washington, represents Chelan County. Buck D. Workman, Vice-President, represents Cascade and Columbia. Jonathan C. Thompson, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents the Commission's regulatory staff ("Commission Staff" or "Staff"). Contact information provided at the conference for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this order.
- 4 **PETITIONS FOR INTERVENTION.** No petitions to intervene were filed.
- 5 **PROTECTIVE ORDER.** A protective order will not be entered in this docket.
- DISCOVERY. The parties asked that the discovery rules be invoked in this docket, pursuant to WAC 480-07-400. The matter is one that qualifies for discovery, and the rules are invoked.
- 7 **PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE.** The Commission adopts the following procedural schedule:

April 1, 2005 Parties file and serve exhibit and witness lists

April 6, 2005 Evidentiary hearing

- ORDER OF CONSOLIDATION. Pursuant to WAC 480-07-320, we find that there are facts and issues of law that are common to both of these dockets and order that the two dockets be consolidated for consideration and hearing. The Commission may sever the two dockets when it deems that doing so is appropriate and may enter a single order or separate orders in the dockets as appropriate.
- 9 **DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS.** Parties must file with the Commission an original plus six (6) copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. Paper copies of these materials are required to conform to the format and publication guidelines set forth in WAC 480-07-395 and 480-07-460, and must be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.
- All filings must be mailed to the Commission Execcutive Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250, or delivered by hand to the Commission Executive Secretary at the Commission's Records Center at the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W., Olympia, Washington, 98504. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided by e-mail delivery to <<u>records@wutc.wa.gov</u>>. Alternatively, Parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette including the filed document(s). The Commission prefers that parties furnish

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electronic copies in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format, supplemented by a separate file in MS Word 6.0 (or later), or WordPerfect 5.1 (or later) format. Parties are required to organize and identify electronic files as specified in WAC 480-07-140(5).

- ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION. The Commission supports the informal settlement of matters before it. Parties are encouraged to consider means of resolving disputes informally. The Commission does have limited ability to provide dispute resolution services; if you wish to explore those services, please call the Director, Administrative Law Division, at 360-664-1142.
- NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
