- NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket No. TC-041725 is an application by CWA, Inc. d/b/a Central Washington Airporter (CWA or Applicant) for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to extend its current authority¹ to now furnish passenger and express service between Yakima, Ellensburg, and Cle Elum.
- 2 **CONFERENCE.** The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Olympia, Washington on December 8, 2004, before Administrative Law Judge Theodora M. Mace.
- APPEARANCES. David L. Rice, attorney, Seattle, Washington, represents CWA. Jonathan Thompson, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents the Commission's regulatory staff ("Commission Staff" or "Staff").²

¹ CWA already provides airporter service between Yakima, Ellensburg, and Cle Elum (on the one hand) and Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (on the other hand).

- PETITIONS FOR INTERVENTION. This application was published in the Commission's weekly Docket for October 11, 2004. The Commission received no protests to the application within 20 days of publication as required by WAC 480-30-032(1). Because this application appeared to request authority that would overlap with that requested in a contemporaneous application filed by Diamond-West Transportation Co., Inc. (Diamond-West) in Docket No. TC-041725, it was noticed for a prehearing conference concurrent with the prehearing conference in the Diamond-West proceeding. Under WAC 480-30-032, the Commission may consolidate such applications for joint consideration.
- CONSOLIDATION. Because no protest to this application was filed, and because Diamond-West amended its contemporaneous application to eliminate service that would overlap with that requested in the CWA application, the Commission will not consolidate this application with the Diamond-West application.
- 6 **PROTECTIVE ORDER.** No protective order is required.
- 7 **DISCOVERY.** The parties do not require discovery in this proceeding.

- PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE. Because there was no protest to CWA's application, and because the contemporaneous application of Diamond-West was amended to eliminate overlap with the CWA application, the CWA application will proceed on a paper record. CWA will provide documentary evidence in support of the application on or before January 7, 2005.
- 9 **DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS.** Parties must file with the Commission an original plus ten (10) copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. Paper copies of these materials are required to conform to the format and publication guidelines set forth in WAC 480-07-395 and 480-07-460, and must be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.
- All filings must be mailed to the Commission Executive Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250, or delivered by hand to the Commission Secretary at the Commission's Records Center at the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W., Olympia, Washington, 98504. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided by e-mail delivery to records@wutc.wa.gov. Alternatively, Parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette including the filed document(s). The Commission prefers that parties furnish electronic copies in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format, supplemented by a separate file in MS Word 6.0 (or later), or WordPerfect 5.1 (or later) format. Parties are required to organize and identify electronic files as specified in WAC 480-07-140(5).

NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
