

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AFFIDAVIT CERTIFYING USE OF UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUNDS

I, Russell Ramsey being of lawful age and duly sworn, on my oath state that I am Vice President and CTO of The Toledo Telephone Co., Inc. ("Company"), that I am authorized to execute this affidavit on behalf of the Company, and that the facts set forth in this affidavit are true to the best of my knowledge, information and belief. I hereby certify to the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission ("Commission"), for use by the Commission in providing the certification to the Federal Communications Commission and Universal Service Administrative Company required by 47 C.F.R. § 54.314, as follows:

- (1) that during the calendar year 2004, the Company provided the supported services required by 47 U.S.C. § 214(e) and as described in the Commission Order granting the Company Eligible Telecommunications Carrier ("ETC") status;
- (2) that during the 2004 calendar year, the Company advertised the availability of supported services and the charges for them as required by 47 U.S.C. § 214(e) and as described in the Commission Order granting the Company ETC status;
- (3) that the Company is eligible to receive federal high-cost universal service support from the sources described in 47 CFR § 54.314;
- (4) that funds from the sources described in 47 CFR §54.314 received by the Company will be used only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of the facilities and services for which the support is intended;
- (5) that the amount of federal high-cost universal service fund support received by the Company for calendar year 2004 was \$ 2,116,684; and
- (6) the loop counts on which federal high-cost universal service support received by the Company for the calendar year 2004 was based were as follows: for the first quarter of calendar year 2004, 2242; for the second quarter of calendar year 2004, 2242; for the third quarter of calendar year 2004, 2242; and for the fourth quarter of calendar year 2004, 2242.



RAMSEY REPORT

In July 2005, we completed the installation of our new central office switch. For customers, the only noticeable difference between the new and the old, will be the slightly different recorded announcements. The old switch had been in service since 1990, filled an entire room with large cabinets and switching equipment, and could switch 2,500 lines. By contrast, the new switch is roughly the size of a dorm room refrigerator, and has the capacity to switch 50,000 customer lines. This new switch is the latest generation of switches that will allow us to provide traditional telephone service and integrate with new technologies for advanced services, such as voice and data over Internet networks.



Phil Cappalonga has been named The Toledo Telephone Co., Inc.'s new Chief Financial Officer. He joined the company a couple of months ago. Phil is from the Portland area where he previously worked as the Director of Finance for Western Independent Networks, Inc. WIN is a consortium of 26 independent telephone companies of which Toledo Telephone Co., Inc. is a member. Before WIN, he was employed by Alamosa, PCS an affiliate of Sprint, PCS. Phil played a vital role in setting up the company's infrastructure for the entire Northwest Region.

Phil is originally from the East Coast. He grew up in the Philadelphia, Pennsylvania area and received his undergraduate degree from Bentley College in Massachusetts in 1992. He called Boston his home before he relocated to Portland in November of 1996. He started working at Schnitzer Investments soon after his arrival. 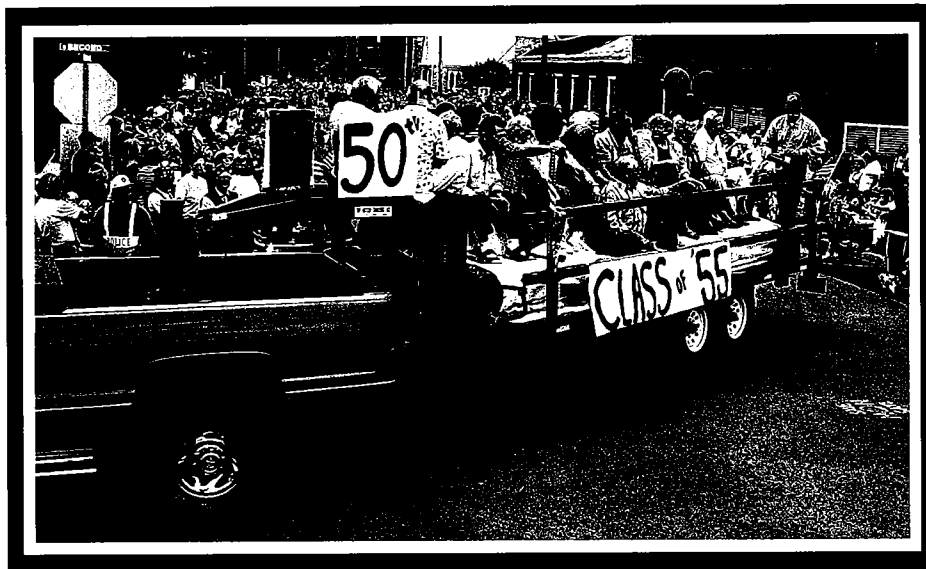



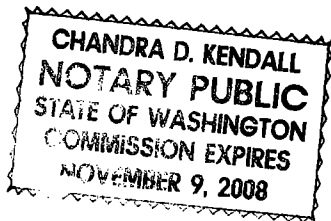
