- On July 29, 2008, Meeker Southern Railroad filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a petition to modify an existing highway-rail grade crossing at 134th Avenue East, Pierce County, USDOT Crossing Number 085536R. The complete file in this matter sets forth the issues in more detail and is available for public inspection at the Commission's offices in the Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington, and on the Commission's web site at www.utc.wa.gov/081407.
- On August 12, 2008, the Commission sent a letter to Pierce County Public Works and Utilities (Pierce County) notifying them of the petition and requesting they respond within twenty days whether they support the petition or not.
- On August 27, 2008, Pierce County notified the Commission that it does not support the petition.
- STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The Commission will hear this matter pursuant to Part IV of RCW 34.05 pertaining to adjudicative proceedings, including but not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, RCW 34.05.452, RCW 81.04.110, RCW 81.44.010, and RCW 81.53.060. The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under RCW Title 81, and has legal authority to regulate alterations in the style or nature of construction of existing grade crossing, and to apportion the expense of such a change between the railroad and the

municipality or county affected pursuant to RCW 81.53, including without limitation, RCW 81.53.060 and RCW 81.53.110. Statutes involved, in addition to those previously cited, include those within RCW 81.04, RCW 81.44, RCW 81.53, and WAC 480-07.

- The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in WAC 480-07 in this proceeding.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That the Commission will hold a prehearing conference in this matter at 9:30 a.m., on April 23, 2009, in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, resolve scheduling and other procedural matters, including establishing dates for distributing evidence and workpapers, identify the issues in the proceeding and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430. Among other things, the administrative law judge may consider the procedure and timing for dispositive motions.
- INTERVENTION: Persons seeking to intervene in the proceeding must file written petitions to intervene at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. See WAC 480-07-355(a). In addition, party representatives must file notices of appearance with the Commission, as required by WAC 480-07-345(2), no later than the day before the conference. If any party or witness needs an interpreter or other assistance, they should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for the evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference or by later written notice.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440. The Commission specifically invokes the sanction provisions of WAC 480-07-450 which allow the Commission to seek penalties for a party in default.
