ORDER RESCINDING GRADE CROSSING PROTECTIVE FUND GRANT

Requesting Disbursement from the Grade Crossing Protective Fund

BACKGROUND

- On February 17, 2016, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) entered an order granting a petition by Yakima County Public Services (Yakima County) for a disbursement from the Grade Crossing Protective Fund (GCPF) totaling \$20,000. The grant was to provide partial funding for a project related to upgrading the active warning devices at a railroad-highway grade crossing, identified as USDOT 099216G, located at Lateral A Road and the White Swan Branch Line's tracks in Yakima county.
- On December 7, 2016, Yakima County submitted a letter requesting to withdraw its petition for GCPF funds. After receiving grant approval from the Commission, Yakima County prepared plans and specifications for the project and advertised it for bid in April 2016. Unfortunately, the lowest bid received was 50 percent over the engineer's estimate. As conditions exist, Yakima County predicts that even after revising plans and scaling down the scope of the project, the project costs would be too high and the county does not have funds to cover cost overruns.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

On February 17, 2016, the Commission approved a petition by Yakima County for a Grade Crossing Protective Fund disbursement of \$20,000. The disbursement was approved after considering the relative priorities of all funding applications pending at the time.

- The Commission's approval of the petition included a condition that the funds be used by December 31, 2016.
- On December 7, 2016, Yakima County, having determined that the project could not be completed by the required date, filed a letter requesting to withdraw its petition for grant funds.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

The Grade Crossing Protective Fund grant awarded to Yakima County Public Services is rescinded, thereby returning the amount of \$20,000 to the Grade Crossing Protective Fund account for further disbursement consideration.

The Secretary of the Commission has delegated authority over this matter pursuant to Order 01 in Docket A-151775. The Secretary finds this Order to be consistent with the public interest.
