7	JUDGE PEARSON: Good morning. My name is
8	Rayne Pearson. I'm an administrative law judge for the
9	Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, and
10	I am the presiding officer for today's hearing being
11	conducted at the Commission's headquarters in Olympia.
12	Today is Wednesday, April 26th, 2017, and
13	the time is 9:00 a.m.
14	Today's hearing involves a total of five
15	household goods carriers, so the first thing that we
16	will do is take a roll call to determine who's present.
17	And as you can see, there's a court reporter here
18	creating a record of today's proceedings, so when I call
19	your name, please both raise your hand to identify
20	yourself and also give a verbal response like "here" or
21	"present."
22	The first is Docket TV-170168, Tiraogo

24	MR. SIMPORE: Present.

1 subject to being held in default and having an order 2 entered against them without having a chance to address 3 the Commission, and I will take those cases up later 4 this morning. 5 So each of you are here because the 6 Commission filed a complaint alleging that your company 7 is performing or advertising to perform work as a 8 household goods carrier without the required permit 9 that's issued by the Commission. 10 So the purpose of today's proceeding is to 11 formally explain what your choices are and then hear 12 from each of you regarding which option you want to 13 pursue. 14 You can choose one of two options on behalf 15 of your company, either cease and desist providing, 16 offering, and advertising unpermitted household goods 17 services. So if you choose that option, you will need 18 to demonstrate what you've done to shut down your 19 business either completely or partially such as taking 20 down your website or changing your online 21 advertisements. 22 The second choice is to ask for a formal 23 classification hearing, and if you choose that option, 24 you're contesting the allegations in the complaint and 25 claim not to be conducting household goods moving

1	services. And if you choose that option, we will
2	schedule a formal hearing for a date in the near future
3	with a deadline two to three weeks from now for both
4	your company and the Commission to declare witnesses and
5	file all exhibits.
6	So each of you has a right to be heard by
7	the Commission. I will call each of you up to do that
8	individually. Ms. Rachel Jones, who is seated over here
9	to my right, will be representing the Commission, and if
10	you've not already met her or spoke to her on the phone,
11	she is a Commission compliance investigator.
12	And now that we've gone over the options
13	that you have today, I will explain the rest of today's
14	procedures. So I will call you each up here in a few
15	minutes so you can make your choice on how to proceed,
16	and at that time, I will swear you in so that anything
17	that you say will be considered sworn testimony.
18	Once you're sworn in, I will ask if you
19	understand your options for today's hearing and then ask
20	you to state your choice. And if there's anything else
21	that you want to explain to me, you can do so at that
22	time.
23	In each of the complaints, Commission Staff
24	has alleged that you're providing household goods moving
25	services without a permit and is also seeking to have a
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1	penalty imposed. The law sets the maximum penalty for
2	each violation at \$5,000 per violation, and Staff will
3	be making a penalty recommendation as part of any agreed
4	order. Ms. Jones will be explaining that
5	recommendation, but the Commission will make the final
6	decision about the amount of penalty to be imposed.
7	So I see someone else has just joined us in
8	the room. What's your name, sir?
9	MR. PONCE: Ed Ponce.
10	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
11	MR. PONCE: Eduardo Ponce.
12	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So that is Docket
13	TV-170169 America's Moving Machine?
14	MR. PONCE: Correct.
15	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
16	Okay. So Ms. Jones will be explaining and
17	presenting any penalty recommendation, but the
18	Commission will make the final decision about the
19	appropriate penalty to be imposed.
20	So if you choose to testify about how you
21	are getting out of the household goods business, I will
22	allow you to make a statement explaining how you plan to
23	do that. And depending on what proof you can provide,
24	you should be able to reach an agreed order resolving
25	this matter with Commission Staff, and you can speak to
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1	Ms. Jones about that during the recess.
2	And if you choose to contest the allegations
3	in the complaint, like I said, we will schedule another
4	hearing, so if that's the choice that you're going to
5	make, it would be helpful to know your availability for
6	the next month or so when you come up here.
7	After I hear from each of you, we'll take a
8	break to give Staff time to meet with each of you and
9	prepare a final disposition for your cases.
10	And, Ms. Jones, I'll go ahead and swear you
11	in at this point. If you could please stand and raise
12	your right hand.
13	(Rachel Jones sworn.)
14	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
15	So I'll begin with the companies who have
16	made an appearance today, and then after hearing from
17	each of those companies, I will address the companies
18	who have not appeared today, which I believe is just one
19	at this point.
20	And, Ms. Jones, when I call those
21	nonappearance cases, you can make a brief summary of the
22	status of each case and can set your motion for default.

12	suspended, which means that it would not become due and
13	payable unless you violated the orders. So that's meant
14	to deter future illegal operations. So a certain amount
15	would be held out for a couple of years and provided
16	that you no longer advertised or operated as a household
17	goods mover, it would go away after that two-year
18	period.
19	So when we call each of you back up, I'll
20	just make sure that you understand the order, and I will
21	sign it on the record here today and you will leave here
22	with a copy of it. That's our plan.

19	miss a payment, you could risk imposition of the \$4,500
20	penalty as well.
21	Okay. And the order to cease and desist is
22	permanent, so that doesn't expire after the two years.
23	That goes on forever that you cannot operate without a
24	permit.
25	Okay. Then I will go ahead and sign this

1	order provided that you don't have any other questions?

22	you heard me explain the two-year suspension date and
23	the cease and desist? And it looks like you made a \$200
24	payment today?
25	MR. GALEANA: Mm-hmm.

1	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And then you will pay
2	400 on May 26th and 400 on June 26th?
3	MR. GALEANA: Correct.
4	JUDGE PEARSON: All right. Do you have any
5	other questions?
6	MR. GALEANA: No, ma'am.
7	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. I will go ahead and
8	sign this and we will get you a copy.
9	MR. GALEANA: Thank you.
10	JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.
11	Next is TV-170206, Jacob Raich and Super
12	Friends Moving.
13	All right. And, Mr. Reich, you
14	understand
15	MR. RAICH: Yes.
16	JUDGE PEARSON: the order that you've
17	signed today?
18	And, Ms. Jones, it looks like, again,
19	there's a finding of two violations and a \$5,000
20	penalty, \$2,500 of which will be suspended for two
21	years; is that correct?
22	MS. JONES: That is correct.
23	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And let's see, it
24	looks like you paid the penalty in full so
25	MR. RAICH: Yes.

1	JUDGE PEARSON: we don't need to address
2	that.
3	So I will sign this and you're good to go.
4	Thank you.
5	MR. RAICH: Thank you.
6	JUDGE PEARSON: And then finally TV-170169,
7	Eduardo Ponce. If you could come forward.
8	And you had an opportunity to read through
9	the order and you understand all of its contents?
10	MR. PONCE: Yes, I do.
11	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And, Ms. Jones, it
12	looks again here like there are two violations and a
13	\$5,000 penalty, \$4,000 of which will be suspended for
14	two years, correct?
15	MS. JONES: That is correct.
16	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And with respect to
17	the payment plan, it looks like you made a \$100 payment
18	today?
19	MR. PONCE: Correct.
20	JUDGE PEARSON: And then you will make \$300
21	payments May 26th, June 26th, and July 26th?
22	MR. PONCE: Correct.
23	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And you heard
24	everything I said about making sure those payments are
25	made on time and

1	MR. PONCE: I did.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. All right. Then I
3	have signed this and once you get your copy, you'll be
4	free to go.
5	MR. PONCE: Thank you.
б	JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.
7	So that concludes the list of the companies
8	that were present in the hearing room today. There's no
9	one else in the hearing room who hasn't appeared, so we
10	can proceed with the motion for default for TV-170197,
11	Joseph Schott, d/b/a Pain Management Moving. I've had a
12	chance to review that docket, including the evidence
13	that Staff presented that there was an offer for an
14	intrastate move in Washington and advertising that meets
15	the definition under the statute.
16	So what is the Commission's motion at this
17	point with respect to Joseph Schott, d/b/a Pain
18	Management Moving?
19	MS. JONES: We would like the company to be
20	classified as a household goods carrier and we would
21	like for them to cease and desist.
22	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And the penalty would
23	be the full?
24	MS. JONES: And we are seeking the full
25	5,000.

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1	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So nothing would be
2	suspended, correct?
3	MS. JONES: Correct.
4	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So let's go ahead and
5	walk through the evidence you have for this company with
6	respect to the violations, and then if you could also
7	address when and how service was accomplished.
8	MS. JONES: Okay. So a moving offer was
9	obtained by text on March 24th, 2017. Commission record
10	showed that they have never applied for a permit. They
11	were sent a compliance letter February 3rd, 2017. They
12	were served to be here on March 30th, 2017. I reached
13	out to them on March to see if they were going to be
14	attending. I left a voice message. I did not get a
15	call back.
16	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Was it Mr. Schott who
17	was personally served?
18	MS. JONES: His father.
19	JUDGE PEARSON: His father, okay.
20	But it was at his last known residence?
21	MS. JONES: Yes.
22	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
23	MS. JONES: And currently I found them still
24	advertising on Craigslist. I'm kind of concerned
25	because they have now changed their name, same number,

1	same name, but they're going under Northwest Strong
2	Moves Movers.
3	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
4	MS. JONES: And they currently have an
5	advertisement on Facebook.
6	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So I will grant a
7	motion for default for Joseph Schott, d/b/a Pain
8	Management Moving, and I will also sign the order
9	imposing the penalties and finding the company in
10	default.
11	MS. JONES: All right. Thank you.
12	JUDGE PEARSON: Anything else?
13	MS. JONES: No.
14	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Then we are
15	adjourned. Thank you very much.
