**STIPULATED CONTINGENT  
WITHDRAWAL OF PETITION FOR  
AN ADJUDICATIVE PROCEEDING**

1. On May 26, 2017, King County filed a Petition requesting an adjudicative proceeding concerning the application of Chariot Transit, Inc. (Chariot), to provide various transportation services in King County. In particular, King County had concerns about the type of service Chariot intended to provide for “employee commuting solutions”.


2. King County and Chariot have conferred and agreed to the following language to clarify the nature and scope of Chariot’s proposed employee commuter service:

Chariot will also offer employers charter contracts for employee commuter solutions. This service will involve single contracts with single employers pursuant to which the employer will pay a negotiated fee. Multiple employers cannot be combined into a single contract. A vehicle or vehicles, owned by Chariot and operated by a Chariot employee, will transport a single customer’s employees to and from their place of work. Employees will be picked up at one or more designated pick up/drop-off points and transported as a group to a single destination (the place of employment). The return trip will entail pick up at the place of employment and drop off at the designated pickup/drop-off points. This service will not be open to the public, but only to the employees of employers who have contracted with Chariot and only for the purpose of transporting such employees to and from work.

3. King County has agreed to withdraw its Petition for an Adjudicative Proceeding contingent on the Utilities and Transportation Commission including the above language in any certificate granted to Chariot pursuant to the above-referenced application.
