MR. CALLAGHAN: All the consolidated dockets, Your Honor.

So I'll ask Staff to address the need for a hearing including whether there's consensus for proposed topics for a hearing and what those topics would be if so.

MR. CALLAGHAN: Thank you, Your Honor. We believe that it was necessary to include a hearing given that, if the parties could not come to an agreement in this case, that we would need an evidentiary hearing to determine whether the proposed tariff change was in the public interest. That being said, the parties are working towards a settlement, and I believe we're making good progress.

JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. So then what -- do you anticipate that settlement would result in an implementation plan or how does an implementation plan fit into this proposed procedural schedule?

So what I will do is I will discuss the proposed procedural schedule with Commissioners prior to issuing any document after this status conference, and then I will issue an order on the procedural schedule, not necessarily modifying the current procedural schedule in the docket. But should there be a settlement that results in the filing of an implementation plan, then upon filing, the Commission will review the implementation plan and issue -- we would issue an order on that.
