PROCEEDING: On December 17, 1985, Pacific Power & Light Company, hereinafter referred to as "respondent", "company", or "PP&L", filed tariff revisions (UTF 85-387) designed to produce a general increase in its rates and charges for electric service in the state of Washington in the approximate amount of \$13 million.
