

discovery will be conducted pursuant to the Commission's 8

discovery rules in WAC 480-07-400 through 425. WAC 9

480-07-405(2) requires all parties to serve all data 10

11 requests upon all parties in this case.

Does any party object to the Commission 12

13 making an exchange of data request responses a

requirement for parties in discovery in this case? All 14

right. Hearing no objections, I will incorporate that 15

requirement into the prehearing conference order. 16

Regarding electronic filing and electronic 3
