1 Q PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS.

2 A Kathryn E. Iverson; 17244 W. Cordova Court; Surprise, AZ 85387.

3 Q PLEASE STATE YOUR OCCUPATION.

4 A I am a consultant in the field of public utility regulation with Brubaker &
5 Associates, Inc. (BAI), energy, economic and regulatory consultants.

6 Q PLEASE SUMMARIZE YOUR EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND AND
7 WORK EXPERIENCE.

8 A In 1980 I received a Bachelors of Science Degree in Agricultural Sciences from
9 Colorado State University, and in 1983, I received a Masters of Science Degree
10 in Economics from Colorado State University.

11 In March of 1984, I accepted a position as Rate Analyst with the
12 consulting firm Browne, Bortz and Coddington in Denver, Colorado. My
13 duties included evaluation of proposed utility projects, benefit-cost analysis of
14 resource decisions, cost of service studies and rate design, and analyses of
15 transmission and substation equipment purchases.

16 In February 1986, I accepted a position with Applied Economics Group,
17 where I was responsible for utility economic analysis including cogeneration

1 projects, computer modeling of power requirements for an industrial
2 pumping facility, and revenue impacts associated with various proposed
3 utility tariffs. In January of 1989, I was promoted to the position of Vice
4 President. In this position, I assumed the additional responsibilities of project
5 leader on projects, including the analysis of alternative cost recovery methods,
6 pricing, rate design and DSM adjustment clauses, and representation of a
7 group of industrial customers on the Conservation and Least Cost Planning
8 Advisory Committee to Montana Power Company.

9 In March 1992, I accepted a position with ERG International
10 Consultants, Inc., of Golden, Colorado as Senior Utility Economist. While at
11 ERG, I was responsible for the cost-effectiveness analysis of demand-side
12 programs for Western Area Power Administration customers. I also assisted
13 in the development of a reference manual on the process of Integrated
14 Resource Planning including integration of supply and demand resource,
15 public participation, implementation of the resource plan and elements of
16 writing a plan. I lectured and provided instructional materials on the key
17 concept of life-cycle costing seminars held to provide resource planners and
18 utility decision-makers with a background and basic understanding of the
19 fundamental techniques of economic analysis. My work also included the
20 evaluation of a marginal cost of service study, assessment of avoided cost

1 rates, and computer modeling relating engineering simulation models to
2 weather-normalized loads of schools in California.

3 In November of 1994, I accepted a position with Drazen-Brubaker &
4 Associates, Inc. In April, 1995 the firm of Brubaker & Associates, Inc. was
5 formed. It includes most of the former DBA principals and Staff. Since joining
6 this firm, I have performed various analyses of integrated resource plans,
7 examination of cost of service studies and rate design, as well as estimates of
8 transition costs and restructuring plans.

9 In addition to our main office in St. Louis, the firm also has branch
10 offices in Phoenix, Arizona; Chicago, Illinois; Corpus Christi, Texas; and
11 Plano, Texas.

12 **Q HAVE YOU EVER TESTIFIED BEFORE A REGULATORY BODY?**

13 **A** Yes. I have testified before the regulatory commissions in Colorado, Idaho,
14 Georgia, Michigan, Montana, New Mexico, Oregon, Texas, Washington and
