1/ P.L. 112-10, the Full Year Continuing Resolution, provided funding for LIHEAP through September 30, 2011 at \$4.7 billion.

Of this amount, \$4.5 billion was provided for the basic grant and \$200 million in contingency funds which have been released.

2/ The President's FY 2012 Budget would provide \$1.98 billion in block grant funds and \$589.9 million in contingency funds.

3/ The Senate Appropriations bill would provide \$3.4 billion in block grant based on the Tier One (hold harmless) formula and \$199.9 million in contingency.

4/ The House draft bill would provide \$3.39 billion, all of which would be provided by the regular program formula.
