Subject: Project Traffic Volumes Center Parkway

In July 11, 1997, The Transpo Group completed a traffic forecast study for the commercial, retail and business area planned for development located on between Columbia Center Boulevard on the east, Steptoe Street on the west, SR-240 on the north, and the railroad tracks on the south. When fully built out the Tapteal Business and commercial are estimated to generate an average of 15,955 daily trips. This Transpo study estimated that 60 percent of these trips would utilize Columbia Center Boulevard, with the remain 40 percent using Steptoe Street for ingress/egress to the area. The study did not consider the extension of Center Parkway between Tapteal Avenue and Gage Boulevard as an alternative means of access to the area.

Using the projected land-use and average daily traffic volumes obtained from The Transpo Group study. The following Tables reflect the, existing conditions (Table 1) and the projected traffic volumes with and without the extension of Center Parkway at project completion (Table 2) and twenty years following project completion including full build-out of the Tapteal business and commercial area (Table 3).

The overall vehicle miles of travel would be reduced with the Center Parkway Extension project. At project build out in 2023, the estimated 3,350 vehicles per day using the extension would have had to use other streets in the network if the extension were not constructed. Without the extension these trips would be less direct to/from the Tapteal area. This additional distance for these each would average to over ½ mile per trip. Therefore, the extension of Center Parkway would eliminate over 610,000 miles of travel per year. Assuming an average of 20 miles to the gallon, this would mean a saving of over 30,500 gallons of fuel saved each year. Further saving would be in reduced travel time; and less air, noise and other pollutants associated with vehicles. These savings would be further compounded by reducing traffic volumes on Columbia Center Boulevard, which would be operating at a level-of-service E/F by 2023, and transferring that traffic to routes that have spare capacity.


