RE: *Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission v. Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities*, Docket UE-160082

TO ALL PARTIES:

On April 28, 2016, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) entered Order 01, Order Allowing Tariff Revisions to Become Effective Subject to Conditions (Order 01) in this docket. Order 01, among other things, approved an Electric Vehicle Supply Pilot Program (Pilot Program) and required Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities (Avista or Company) to file quarterly reports documenting program participation levels, expenditures, and revenues for each service offered under the Pilot Program beginning August 1, 2016.

On February 8, 2018, the Commission entered Order 02, Granting Petition; Allowing Tariff Revisions to Become Effective (Order 02). Order 02 allowed for an extension of Avista's Pilot Program, and reduced the reporting requirement to semi-annual.

Avista filed its most recent semi-annual report on April 29, 2019.

On May 30, 2019, Commission staff (Staff) filed a letter informing the Commission that Staff had reviewed the report and found that it complies with the requirements of Order 02.

The Commission accepts the semi-annual report filed April 29, 2019, as in compliance with Order 02.
