I struggle to make the bills every month, but we make them. While the raise of 3% may not seem like a lot in a month where the bills is only \$80 – what about winter when I need to keep my kids warm? I can't help but wonder why when Avista posts profits being up 11% in 2016 would they need to increase costs to their customer 2.9%? The news recently stated that in 2016 Avista made a profit of \$14 million. And now they are asking it's consumers for an additional 15 million.

Unfortunately, I do not get rate increases in my job two times per year, and upon research I see that Avista requested 2 rate increases in 2016. While I understand there are costs to operating power companies, I do not understand why power companies can make profits off the community. I don't get to choose which power company I use. Avista has a monopoly on Spokane and the outlying areas. If this rate increase is approved, the winter in my household will be a lot harder than it should. Another rate increase would be a huge financial hardship on my household.
