- NATURE OF PROCEEDINGS: On February 6, 2008, PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power & Light Company (PacifiCorp) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) revisions to its currently effective Tariff WN U-74. By its filing PacifiCorp proposed to increase rates and charges for electric service provided to customers in the state of Washington by \$34.9 million, or 14.6 percent.
- Absent Commission action, the proposed tariff revisions would have become effective by operation of law on March 7, 2008. The Commission, however, suspended the filing on February 14, 2008, PacifiCorp having waived its right to have the matter considered at the Commission's regular open public meeting.
- 3 **CONFERENCE/PRESIDING OFFICER.** The Commission convened a prehearing conference in this proceeding at Olympia, Washington on March 6, 2008, before Administrative Law Judge Dennis J. Moss.
- PARTY REPRESENTATIVES: Sarah E. Edmonds, in-house legal counsel, Portland, Oregon, and Katherine McDowell, McDowell & Rackner P.C., Portland, Oregon, represent PacifiCorp. Simon ffitch and Sarah Shifley, Assistant Attorneys General, Seattle, Washington, represent the Public Counsel Section of the Washington Office of Attorney General (Public Counsel). Donald T. Trotter, Robert D. Cedarbaum and Jonathan Thompson, Assistant Attorneys General, Olympia,

- Washington, represent the Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff).1
- 5 Melinda J. Davison and Irion Sanger, Davison Van Cleve, Portland, Oregon, represent the Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities (ICNU). Brad Purdy, Attorney at Law, Boise, Idaho, represents The Energy Project.
- Contact information for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix 2 to this 6 order.
- **PETITIONS FOR INTERVENTION.** ICNU filed a petition to intervene on 7 February 19, 2008. The Energy Project filed a petition to intervene on March 6, 2008. No party objected to these petitions and they were granted.²
- **PROTECTIVE ORDER.** The Commission will enter its standard form of protective 8 order in this proceeding.
- 9 **DISCOVERY.** The parties will continue to conduct discovery pursuant to the Commission's rules governing discovery, WAC 480-07-400, et seq.
- MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE SUPPLEMENTAL TESTIMONY. On March 10 4, 2008, PacifiCorp filed a motion seeking leave to file supplemental testimony including narrative testimony and a revised results-of-operations exhibit that conforms to a format preferred by Commission Staff. The Commission granted PacifiCorp's motion.

The Commission prefers that materials be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The

Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.

- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided by e-mail delivery to records@utc.wa.gov. Alternatively, parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette or a CD including the filed document(s). The Commission prefers that parties furnish electronic copies in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format, supplemented by a separate file in MS Word 6.0 (or later), or WordPerfect 5.1 (or later) format. Parties are required to organize and identify electronic files as specified in WAC 480-07-140(5).
- a one-day extension of the paper-filing requirement under WAC 480-07-145(6), allowing electronic submission of documents with the Commission on the filing deadlines set forth in the procedural schedule.
