SUBJECT: Docket TV-111513; Application for Permanent Authority

On August 19, 2011, All Seasons Moving Hauling & More, Inc., d/b/a All Seasons Moving, filed Docket TV-111513 requesting permanent household goods authority.

The commission granted the company temporary authority subject to conditions pending a decision on its application for permanent authority. The company has operated under Household Goods Carrier Permit No. THG-64412, since September 15, 2011.

Under WAC 480-15-330, the commission will grant or deny an application for permanent authority after conducting a complete review of the application filings, supporting statements, reports, or other information necessary to determine fitness, public interest, and current or future public convenience and necessity.

Compliance staff worked with the company providing technical assistance during its temporary operations. Investigator Richard Smith completed a Safety Compliance Review, a Household Goods Technical Assistance and Records Review Checklist. Investigator Smith found the company in general compliance and on June 22, 2012, he recommended the applicant be considered for permanent authority.

The current provisional permit THG-64412 is in order as follows:

- o Records Center has the annual report for 2011 on file;
- o Financial Services reports the company has paid appropriate regulatory fees;
- o The commission does not have any outstanding penalty or other fines;
- o Consumer Protection does not have a pending consumer complaint;
- o Transportation Safety does not have a pending compliance action; and
- o Company representative attended HHG training on January 17, 2012.

I recommend the commission grant TV-111513 without hearing and reissue Permit THG-64412 to HG-64412 All Seasons Moving Hauling & More, Inc., d/b/a All Seasons Moving, as unrestricted permanent authority to operate as a household goods carrier in the state of Washington.

391.21(a)), Using a driver who has not completed and furnished an employment application.

Mr. Green immediately implemented new procedures to resolve each of the violations discovered and assured that being highly interested in maintaining a safe operation, he will stay on top of regulatory requirements for his business. He explained for 391.21(a), his driver is also his brother-in-law so he did not think a family member had the same requirement.

Mr. Green said his current plans are to hire more drivers and purchase an additional truck before the end of this year that will be for use primarily in interstate operations.

#### DRIVERS WITH RED FLAG VIOLATIONS:

There were no red flag drivers for this carrier.

Controlled substance and alcohol testing records

This carrier is not required to participate in pre-employment alcohol and drug testing, nor is the carrier required to be a participant in random drug and alcohol random testing due to the size of their operating vehicle.

# Carrier Operating Description:

Currently this carrier operates in the Spokane and immediate surrounding areas, including to Couer d' Alene Idaho. Their interstate authority is active and UCR paid 3-13-2012 for the current year. The records required for all interstate trips were reviewed and found to be in order with no violations discovered, Records of duty status (RODS) were provided showing the carrier routinely use the 100 air mile exemption rule. Interstate and intrastate trips and RODS were confirmed by reviewing gas receipts for verification of time reporting. PC Mller was also used to calculate the distance for the interstate trips to Couer d' Alene Idaho as being under 100 air miles. RODS were not all in appropriate form, routinely missing ending time but did show a start time and total hours for the date. So even though this will show in Part B as a violation, RODS information was still present to determine hours worked each day while using the passenger carrier hours criteria and the 70 hour work week rule.

#### Violations discovered:

391, 11(b)(6); the carrier failed to have the drive provide a 12 months list of any traffic violations. This issue was immediately resolved by Mr. Green.

391.21(a); Using a driver who has not completed and furnished an employment application. Mr. Green explained that his driver is an old friend and never thought about getting an application. This was immediately resolved by the driver issuing an application for his DQ file.

391.(b)(3); Failing to maintain road test certificates in drivers qualification file. This certificate was completed but not put in the DQ file as required. This was immediately resolved by the carrier.

395.8(f); Failing to have driver prepare record of duty status as required. This issue found some RODS with start time and total time for the date but no stop time. Mr. Green immediately resolved this issue by pulling all incorrect RODS and competing the form by adding the stop times.

396.3(b); Failing to keep minimum records of inspection and vehicle maintenance. Mr. Green had records of receipts for maintenance done on his truck and could explain his maintenance plan to me but did not have appropriate documentation in the maintenance file to support what he told me. This issue was immediately resolved by Mr. Green by updating his maintenance file to include required documentation.

396.17(c); Using a commercial motor vehicle not periodically inspected in accordance with minimum standards. Mr. Green said he lost track of time since his vehicle was last inspected Level 1 April 2011. He immediately implemented an new tracking system showing due dates for future inspections.

The carriers gross revenue for 2011 is reported and verified by financial records and tax statements as being \$114,000.00.

Mr. Jason Green, owner was contacted at the carrier's terminal located in Spokane Washington for the purpose of conducting a new entrant review. This carrier has never had a comprehensive review completed. The carriers terminal is an office inside his personal residence, described as a three bedroom single story wood structure with attached garage and built in the 1990"s.

#### REASON FOR INVESTIGATION:

Required for New Entrant Household Goods Transportation carriers between three and 18 months after receiving intrastate authority on 9/15/2011. This carrier has interstate authority since 4/6/2010 but has never had a comprehensive review completed for interstate operations.

#### SCOPE OF INVESTIGATION:

Full comprehensive review using FMCSA eFOTM international sampling policy.

#### PRE-INVESTIGATION:

The carrier was requested at least 48 hours before this compliance review was scheduled to produce the following information immediately upon the arrival of the inspector who would be conducting the review:

A current company profile was obtained 24 hours prior to this review.

#### CARRIER OPERATION DESCRIPTION:

This carrier employs one driver and owns-operates one 24 ft cargo container box straight truck This vehicle is a 1993 GMC license B24884N used by the carrier in both intrastate and interstate commerce. EFOTM sampling of records required reviewing 30 record of duty status 1-2 months from last 6 months and 30 daily vehicle inspection reports from the last 90 days.

Most files for this carrier were found to be generated but in immediate need of additional management attention, indicative the management for this company has not applied enough time to learning management operational requirements. Mr. Green had numerous questions that resulted in a full four hour safety training to be provided to him by the end this review. Still, his interest for operational safety was present. Mr. Green said during our telephone appointment setting conversation three days before the review date, that he had attended the UTC safety training in Olympia Washington on January 17, 2012. I confirmed his attendance by reviewing HHG attendance records in Consumer Affairs at UTC.

During our conversation at his terminal, Mr. Green said, due to the adverse winter weather at the time of his arrival in Olympia on January 17, 2012 and heavy snow fall covering all roads with several inches of snow, UTC business operations had unexpectedly closed for the day. He had however stayed the night prior at a local motel for purpose of attending the HHG training. Arriving at UTC at 8:00 AM on the 17th, he found Sharon Wallace, UTC consumer affairs assistant director and supervisor of the UTC HHG safety training program to be one of few still working and she agreed to provide the safety training to him. However, according to Mr.Green, he only received a condensed version of the training lasting only four hours of the normal eight hour training. Mr. Green said he felt his company did not get all the training benefits as other Household Goods (HHG) carriers receive and this was indicative by the number of violations discovered during this review. See Part B.

I reminded Mr. Green that regardless of the technical assistance training UTC might offer to HHG carriers, it is his obligation and responsibility to learn the regulatory requirements he and his company are to follow in order to have authority to operate and provide for-hire HHG services,

The carriers gross operating revenue was \$114,000.00 for the last fiscal year ending 12/31/2011. This figure was confirmed by financial and tax documents. UTC records indicate that Mr. Green owns 100% of this company and is responsible for all safety management.

#### DRIVER LICENSE CHECK:

Washington State Dept. of Licensing (WDL) was used to verify the carriers driver's license as being current and valid. WDL was used to verify the license because the driver, William A. Zehner, 4/22/1966, ZEHNE-WA-240J2 does not have a CDL, nor is he required to possess a CDL for the size of this carriers vehicles being less than 26001 GVWR.. Mr. Zehner last drove for-hire and in interstate commerce for All Seasons Moving to Couer d' Alene Idaho on 6/11/2012.

#### INVESTIGATION:

The company maintains supporting documents consisting of daily trip records, inspection reports, and other data. Mr. Green is responsible for all documents and records located at the carrier's principal place of business. Files are maintained by trip or date depending upon the type of record.

In conducting this compliance review I examined records pertaining to CFR 49, Parts 382, 383, 387, 390, 391, 392, 393, 395, and 396 as adopted by the UTC in WAC 480-30-999. The following violations were discovered;

391.11(b)(6), Failing to require driver to furnish list of motor vehicle traffic violations each 12 months...


