- On September 9, 2011, Pacific Northwest Transportation Services, Inc. d/b/a Capital Aeroporter; Airport Shuttle (Capital Aeroporter or Applicant), filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) an application for an extension of Certificate No. C-862 for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Operate Motor Vehicles in Furnishing Passenger and Express Service as an Auto Transportation Company (Application). Notice of the Application was published in the Commission's weekly Docket of September 12, 2011.
- 2 The Applicant requests its existing authority be revised to include passenger service between Seattle-Tacoma International Airport and Seattle Waterfront, and between points in Grays Harbor, Lewis, Mason, Thurston, Pierce and King counties and the Seattle waterfront via Seattle-Tacoma International Airport. Limitations include:
 - 1. Closed door service between Seattle-Tacoma International Airport and Seattle Waterfront; and
 - 2. No service may be provided between:
 - a. Hotels in the cities of SeaTac or Tukwila and Cruise Terminals #66 and #91; or
 - b. Between South Center Mall and Cruise Terminals #66 and #91.

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Remove limitation of service to Elbe, Ashford, Longmire and Mt. Rainier.

- 3 On September 16, 2011, Shuttle Express, Inc., d/b/a Shuttle Express, filed a protest to the Application.
- 4 **STATUTORY AUTHORITY**: The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under RCW Title 81, and has legal authority to regulate persons seeking to furnish auto transportation services under RCW 81.68 and WAC 480-30. The statutes that apply to this matter include RCW 80.01, RCW 81.04, RCW 81.28, and RCW 81.68, including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040, RCW 81.04.020, RCW 81.68.030 and RCW 81.68.040. The rules that apply to this matter include those within WAC 480-30 and WAC 480-07.
- 5 **ISSUES**. The issues in this proceeding include whether modifying the existing Capital Aeroporter authority for the service it proposes is necessary and is otherwise consistent with the public interest, and whether other carriers authorized to serve in the requested territory do not or will not provide this service to the satisfaction of the Commission. In addition, the Commission will consider whether to consolidate this proceeding with Dockets TC-111446¹ and TC-111643² and/or with Docket TC-111306.³
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That the Commission will hold a prehearing conference in this matter at 1:00 p.m., on November 22, 2011, in Room 108, First Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington. The prehearing conference is set at the same

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- 7 The Commission sets a prehearing conference to discuss preliminary matters, the hearing process, and to formulate the issues. The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, resolve scheduling matters including hearing dates, to identify the issues in the proceeding and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430.
- 8 **INTERVENTION:** Persons who wish to intervene should file a petition to intervene in writing at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. *See* WAC 480-07-355(a). The Commission will consider oral petitions to intervene during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. Party representatives must file a notice of appearance with the Commission no later than the business day before the conference. *See* WAC 480-07-345(2). Any party or witness in need of an interpreter or other assistance should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for any evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference, on the record of a later conference or hearing session, or by later written notice.
- 9 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
