NOTICE WITHDRAWING PENALTY

RE: Americatel Corporation, Application for Mitigation of Penalty Assessment, Docket UT-150796

TO ALL PARTIES:

On June 2, 2015, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) issued and served a Penalty Assessment against Americatel Corporation (Americatel or Company) in the amount of \$1,000, alleging violations of WAC 480-120-382, which requires telecommunications companies to file annual reports and pay regulatory fees by May 1 each year.

On June 18, 2015, Americated filed a response to the penalty assessment, explaining that the Company was acquired by Matrix Telecom, and its 2014 revenue was reported through Matrix Telecom.

On June 24, 2015, Commission staff (Staff) filed a response recommending the Commission withdraw the penalty against Americatel because the Company has ceased operations in Washington. The Company's cessation became effective at the Commission's June 25, 2015, open meeting in Docket UT-151207.

The Commission's primary objective in any enforcement action is to ensure compliance with a company's legal obligations; penalties both punish noncompliance and provide an incentive to comply in the future. The assessed penalty would further neither of these goals if the Company is no longer registered to provide telecommunications services in Washington. The Commission therefore withdraws the penalty assessed against Americatel based on the Company's cessation of service, effective June 25, 2015.

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THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that the penalty of \$1,000 assessed against Americatel Corporation is withdrawn, and Docket UT-150796 is closed.
