1	PROCEEDINGS
2	JUDGE CAILLE: Let's go on the record. We
3	are here today for the first prehearing conference in
4	the proceeding Kimberly-Clark Tissue Company versus
5	Puget Sound Energy Inc., Docket No. UG-990619. My name
6	is Karen Caille, and I'm the presiding administrative
7	law judge in this proceeding. Today is July the 7th,
8	1999, and we are convened in a hearing room in the
9	Commission's offices in Olympia, Washington.
10	This proceeding is being held to determine
11	whether PSE improperly charged Kimberly-Clark \$367,683
12	in penalties under Rate Schedule 57 for the rate period
13	December 25th through the 29th, 1998, as alleged by
14	Kimberly-Clark in their complaint.
15	Our basic agenda for today will be to take
16	appearances, entertain any motions to intervene, any
17	other motions you deem necessary, set up a procedural
18	schedule and discuss any other business. Does anyone
19	have anything to add to that agenda?
20	MS. GAGNON: No, Your Honor.
21	JUDGE CAILLE: Than the first order of
22	business will be to state your name, spelling your last
	name, who you represent, your street address and
24	mailing address, telephone number, fax number, and if
25	1 '1 11 11 1 ' .1 .

25 you have an e-mail address, would you please give that

- 1 to us as well. For purposes of receiving
- 2 distributions, we want just one person as a
- 3 representative from each company.
- 4 Let's begin with Kimberly-Clark.
- 5 MR. GRAVLEY: My name is Adam Gravley,
- 6 G-R-A-V-L-E-Y, appearing for Kimberly-Clark. I'm with
- 7 the law firm Preston Gates and Ellis, 701 Fifth Avenue,
- 8 Suite 5000, 98104. Telephone is (206) 623-7580; fax,
- 9 (206) 623-7022. Same address, telephone and fax number
- 10 for cocounsel Carol Arnold, who was the assistant
- 11 attorney on the claim that Kimberly-Clark filed. My

- JUDGE CAILLE: I think you've got it all.
- MR. GRAVLEY: And with me today is Mr. Mark
- 16 Armstrong from the Everett mill, and I will let him
- 17 introduce himself.
- MR. ARMSTRONG: My name is Mark Armstrong
- 19 with Kimberly-Clark. Our address is 2600 Federal
- 20 Avenue. That's Everett, Washington, 98201. My phone
- 21 number is (425)259-7396. My fax number is
- 22 (425) 259-7535, and my e-mail address is

- MR. GRAVLEY: If everything could go to Carol
- 25 Arnold and myself at Preston Gates.

- 1 JUDGE CAILLE: The zip code in Seattle,
- 2 that's 98104?
- 3 MR. GRAVLEY: Correct.
- 4 JUDGE CAILLE: For Respondent?
- 5 MS. GAGNON: My name is Andree Gagnon,
- 6 G-A-G-N-O-N. I'm from Perkins Coie and I represent
- 7 Puget Sound Energy. My address is One Bellevue Center,
- 8 411 108th Avenue Northeast, Suite 1800. That's
- 9 Bellevue, Washington, 98004-5584. My telephone is
- 10 (425) 453-7336. The fax is (425) 453-7350. My e-mail

- MR. DONAHUE: Officially, it's William F.
- 17 Donahue, D-O-N-A-H-U-E. Our address at Puget Sound
- 18 Energy is One Bellevue Center Building, 411 108th
- 19 Avenue Northeast, Third Floor, Bellevue, Washington,
- 20 98004-5515. My phone number is (425) 456-2356. The
- 21 fax is (425) 462-3414, and my e-mail address is
- 22 bdonah@puget.com.
- JUDGE CAILLE: Thank you. Let the record
- 24 reflect there are no other appearances. The next item
- 25 on our agenda is motions to intervene, and it looks

- 1 like there are no interventions. Are there any
- 2 preliminary motions?
- MR. GRAVLEY: We have none at this time, Your
- 4 Honor, other than to reiterate our request in the
- 5 Complaint that today you would set a time for the
- 6 adjudicative hearing on our complaint.
- 7 JUDGE CAILLE: There is a motion for
- 8 discovery?
- 9 MR. GRAVLEY: That's correct. We did request
- 10 that Your Honor include in the prehearing order that we
- 11 would be allowed to take discovery under the normal
- 12 Commission rules.
- 13 JUDGE CAILLE: 480-09-480?
- MR. GRAVLEY: Correct, and I have some
- 15 comments in terms of witnesses we expect and timing on
- 16 that when you're interested in that.
- 17 JUDGE CAILLE: As far as scheduling goes,
- 18 we'll do that off the record if no one objects, and
- 19 then we can go back on the record and put that schedule
- 20 on the record.
- Before we do that, do the parties anticipate
- 22 needing a protective order?
- MS. GAGNON: Yes, Your Honor. I would make a
- 24 motion for a protective order.
- JUDGE CAILLE: That motion is granted, and I

- 1 will prepare one of our standard protective orders for
- 2 the Commissioners to sign. Just so it's clear for the
- 3 record too, the discovery rule 480-09-480 is invoked.
- 4 Before we go off the record to discuss the
- 5 schedule, is there any possibility of this being a
- 6 stipulated facts or a paper record?
- 7 MS. GAGNON: I think, Your Honor, that I
- 8 would work with Counsel to stipulate where we can. I
- 9 think it will depend upon discovery responses, but my
- 10 hope is certainly the basic facts like the amount of
- 11 the penalties, the day on which they occurred, that
- 12 those types of facts that we could stipulate to and not
- 13 spend hearing time on those issues.
- MR. GRAVLEY: I would agree with that
- 15 approach.
- JUDGE CAILLE: Let me back up just a minute.
- 17 I said no other appearances, but I have heard from
- 18 Staff that Mr. Cedarbaum will be representing Staff in
- 19 this proceeding, and he is not here today, but he will
- 20 work his schedule around whatever schedule the parties
- 21 agree to today.
- One more item: Will the parties want to have
- 23 an initial order written by me, or would you rather
- 24 this -- you can save some time by having this go
- 25 directly to the Commission and the Commission would

- 1 give a final Commission order, and if you aren't sure
- 2 about it, I'm just raising this now for you to think
- 3 about.
- 4 MS. GAGNON: If we chose that path, would
- 5 Your Honor want a motion? Would that be the way to go?
- 6 JUDGE CAILLE: Or you could state on the
- 7 record here, or perhaps we could even do it at the
- 8 hearing or a motion. We can do it several ways.
- 9 MR. GRAVLEY: We would prefer to defer a
- 10 motion on that for the time being.
- JUDGE CAILLE: Let's go off the record now
- 12 and discuss the schedule.
- 13 (Discussion off the record.)
- 14 JUDGE CAILLE: We have had an off-record
- 15 discussion concerning scheduling of this proceeding,
- 16 and Kimberly-Clark has indicated that it will have two
- 17 to three witnesses, one witness on distribution
- 18 management and possibly two witnesses from the Everett
- 19 mill, and they anticipate about a day for -- a half day
- 20 for your case but then considering cross and rebuttal,
- 21 and Puget Sound Energy will have four to five witnesses
- 22 and will need a day, so we are going to block in
- 23 two-and-a-half days to cover the hearings.
- 24 Discovery will begin right away and continue
- 25 to August 9th, and then there is going to be another

- 1 round of discovery or depositions?
- 2 MR. GRAVLEY: I think our depositions will
- 3 start after August 9, and the parties will work
- 4 together for subsequent data requests and responses.
- 5 JUDGE CAILLE: If there are any problems with
- 6 discovery, as I mentioned off the record, if you cannot
- 7 resolve them among yourselves, then please bring them
- 8 to the Bench and we'll have a conference call or
- 9 whatever and get them settled.
- Discovery will end on September 10th, and
- 11 Kimberly-Clark will be filing it's initial prefile
- 12 testimony on September 20th. Puget Sound Energy will
- 13 file its initial and responsive testimony on October
- 14 the 4th, and Kimberly-Clark will file rebuttal
- 15 testimony on October 18th. The hearings will be held
- 16 on November 1st, 2nd and 3rd in this room, and I will
- 17 send out another hearing notice with the time and a
- 18 reminder to you.
- 19 If anyone plans to file a dispositive motion
- 20 under WAC 480-09-426, that will be due at least 30 days
- 21 before the hearing, and responses will be due 20 days
- 22 before hearing. Is there any other business that we
- 23 need to discuss?
- MS. GAGNON: Your Honor, the only thing we
- 25 didn't address was a briefing schedule for after.

- 1 JUDGE CAILLE: Let's go off the record again
- 2 and we'll do the briefing schedule.
- 3 (Discussion off the record.)
- 4 JUDGE CAILLE: We are back on the record and
- 5 have had a discussion about post-hearing briefing
- 6 schedule. Kimberly-Clark will file their opening brief
- 7 on December the 10th. Puget Sound will file a response
- 8 brief on December the 30th, and Kimberly-Clark will
- 9 file their rebuttal brief on January the 14th.
- 10 Again, I remind the parties that fact
- 11 stipulations are encouraged. The parties are also
- 12 encouraged to consider alternative dispute resolution
- 13 and settlement discussions to resolve their differences
- 14 prior to hearing, and the Commission should be advised
- 15 of any progress you make. I will issue a prehearing
- 16 conference order which will include our procedural
- 17 schedule and other matters, and I will remind you that
- 18 anything you file must be directed to the attention of
- 19 the Commission secretary, Post Office Box 47250, 1300
- 20 South Evergreen Park Drive Southwest, Olympia,
- 21 Washington, 98504-7250, and you need to use both the
- 22 post office box and the street address to accommodate
- 23 the needs of the state mailing distribution system, and
- 24 you should file an original plus 12 copies.
- 25 Is there any other business from anyone?
