RE: 2019 Qualifying Event Notice – February 4, 2019 Event

Dear Mr. Johnson:

Pursuant to paragraph 246 of Final Order No. 6, Dockets UE-040641 and UG-040640 et al.¹, for the purpose of the Qualifying Storm Loss Deferral Mechanism, Puget Sound Energy ("PSE") hereby provides a notification that a qualifying event occurred on February 4, 2019, which marked the second event for 2019.

Starting from the 2018 calendar year, PSE has continued its existing Qualifying Storm Loss Deferral Mechanism for any storm restoration costs incurred on or after January 1, 2018, with the following modifications that were agreed to in settlement and the settlement was approved by the Commission in PSE's 2017 general rate case²:

- (i) the cumulative annual cost threshold for deferral of storms under the Qualifying Storm Loss Deferral Mechanism shall be increased from \$8 million to \$10 million,
- (ii) qualifying events that cost less than \$500,000 will not qualify for deferral, and
- (iii) the cumulative annual cost threshold for the Qualifying Storm Loss Deferral Mechanism shall exclude storm events with costs less than \$500,000.

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PSE will submit, by May 5, 2019, the initial 2019 Qualifying Event Report that summarizes the preliminary costs incurred as a result of repairing storm damage to PSE's electric system because of the two 2019 qualifying storm events. In this report, PSE will indicate if the total restoration costs associated with these events meet the \$500,000 individual event threshold and, if so, the amount of the costs that apply toward the \$10 million cumulative annual threshold for 2019. The amount of storm restoration costs has been deferred if both event and annual thresholds are exceeded.
