- NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket UG-061256 involves a complaint by Cost Management Services, Inc. (CMS), against Cascade Natural Gas Corporation (Cascade), asserting Cascade is violating state and federal law by selling natural gas at retail to customers that take transportation-only service without the necessary contracts and tariffs on file.
- 2 **CONFERENCE.** The Commission convened a prehearing conference in this proceeding at Olympia, Washington on March 1, 2007, before Administrative Law Judge Ann E. Rendahl upon notice to all parties.
- APPEARANCES. John A. Cameron and Francie Cushman, Davis Wright Tremaine, LLP, Portland, Oregon, represent CMS. Lawrence H. Reichman and James M. Van Nostrand, Perkins Coie, LLP, Portland, Oregon, represent Cascade. Edward A. Finklea and Chad M. Stokes, attorneys, Cable Huston Benedict Haagensen & Lloyd LLP, Portland, Oregon, represent the Northwest Industrial Gas Users (NWIGU). Judith Krebs, Assistant Attorney General, Seattle, Washington, represents the Public Counsel Section of the Washington Office of the Attorney General (Public Counsel). Gregory J. Trautman, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents

the Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff).¹ Contact information provided at the conference for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this Order.

PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE. Following the Commission's decision in Order 03, the Commission convened this conference to determine how to proceed, and to establish a procedural schedule to address any remaining issues. The parties stated during the conference that there are several items in the order on which they will seek clarification. How the Commission resolves these issues will determine the course of the proceeding. The parties agreed upon the following procedural schedule for motions for clarification:

- NOTICE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE. The Commission will hold a prehearing conference in this matter on Wednesday, May 2, 2007, at 9:30 a.m. in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington. The purpose of the conference is to establish a procedural schedule to address any remaining issues.
- 6 **DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS.** Parties must file an original plus **seven** copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. These materials must conform to the format and publication guidelines in

¹ In formal proceedings, such as this case, the Commission's regulatory staff functions as an independent party with the same rights, privileges, and responsibilities as any other party to the proceeding. There is an "ex parte wall" separating the Commissioners, the presiding Administrative Law Judge, and the Commissioners' policy and accounting advisors from all parties, including advocacy Staff. *RCW* 34.05.455.

WAC 480-07-395 and WAC 480-07-460. The Commission prefers that materials be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.

- All filings must be mailed or delivered to the Executive Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided through the Commission's Web Portal (www.wutc.wa.gov/e-filing) or by e-mail delivery to records@wutc.wa.gov>. Alternatively, parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a CE or a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette including the filed document(s). Parties should furnish electronic copies in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format, supplemented by a separate file in MS Word 6.0 (or later), or WordPerfect 5.1 (or later) format. Parties are required to follow WAC 480-07-140(5) in organizing and identifying electronic files.
- proceeding, the presiding officer granted a one-day extension of the paper-filing requirement, allowing parties to submit documents to the Commission electronically on the filing deadline. Parties may submit documents electronically either through the Commission's Records Center Web Portal (www.wutc.wa.gov/e-filing) or via e-mail to records@wutc.wa.gov, and must file an original, plus seven paper copies, of the document with the Commission by the following business day. Finally, to perfect filing, parties must provide courtesy copies to the presiding administrative law judge and advisory staff as well as the parties to the proceeding.
