Puget Sound Energy, Inc. in the 2007 GRC Partial Settlement Re: Service Quality, Meter and Billing Performance, and Low Income Bill Assistance paragraph 43, has agreed with all parties to increase the HELP benefits:

The Parties agree that PSE will increase HELP benefits for qualifying low income customers by increasing the total aggregate funding cap for HELP, including benefits and administrative costs, to \$15 million per year from approximately \$10.25 million per year. This \$15 million will be distributed 75 percent to electric low income and 25 percent to natural gas low

income customers. In addition, aggregate HELP funds not distributed to qualifying customers in any single program year will be carried over to provide supplemental benefit funding in the next program year.
