In looking over PSE's 20 year long term plan, what I notice is the retreating tone rather than a visionary report. Statements that describe the

energy choices made, end with the explanation of "least cost" which I read to mean - the cheapest choice. This is short term planning and only factors in dollars not impacts of these choices. Reduce costs, weak solar

Explanations of why no investments in wind & solar investment & geothermal. PSE fits fear of lawsuits and voters past rejection of carbon pricing. Children have already sued the state for harming their future due to inaction, and the people coming will be coming with a ballot initiative as soon as we gather 260,000 signatures.

As a Presbyterian I am called to be a prophet - what visionary! It is the season of Lent as we spend 40 days in the desert and darkness. We take this time to repent which mean to turn away from sin.
