Does BDI currently own, lease or otherwise have in its possession any of the equipment that BDI identified in its August 2021 or January 2022 proposals to PCA for OCC Rejects disposal services? If yes, describe which equipment BDI owns, leases or other otherwise has in its possession and when it acquired the equipment.

RESPONSE:

The August 2021 proposal to PCA identified power units ("Tractor Semis"), 53-foot belt trailers and a loader and the January 2022 proposal to PCA identified power units ("Tractor Semis"), 53-foot refuse trailers, a loader, and a tink bucket. Basin Disposal, Inc. acquired the tink bucket, owns multiple power units, and arranged to lease two additional power units to serve PCA, but does not currently lease or own the trailers or loader that it had intended to acquire for service to PCA under the referenced proposals. Basin had arranged to lease or acquire all additional equipment identified, and did in fact lease a trailer to service PCA, but after PCA ignored Basin's proposal and continued to rely on Jammie's illegal solid waste collection service Basin returned the trailer and did not move forward with leasing or acquiring the other equipment.
