- 1 JUDGE MACE: Let's be on the record in
- 2 Docket UT-023003. This is the review of unbundled
- 3 loop -- the review of unbundled loop and switching
- 4 rates and the review of deaveraged zone rate
- 5 structure, Docket Number UT-023003, which I just
- 6 indicated.
- 7 My name is Theodora Mace. I'm the
- 8 Administrative Law Judge assigned to the case. We're
- 9 going to have a number of people on the conference
- 10 bridge and we also have counsel in the hearing room.
- 11 I'm going to run through the list of people that are
- 12 on the conference bridge that I know of, and if I
- 13 have not recited your name, then please let me know.
- 14 David Gabel, Steven Burns, Karen Frame,
- 15 Catherine Ronis and Robert Strayer, Marsha Prosini,
- 16 Pam Beinar, Mike Matthews, Greg Kopta, Natalie Baker,
- 17 and let me indicate that Shannon Smith, counsel for
- 18 Staff, is in the hearing room.
- 19 Have I missed anyone?
- MR. COOK: David Cook, representing AT&T.
- JUDGE MACE: David Cook.
- MR. TURNER: And Steve Turner, I'm on here,
- 23 as well, also for AT&T.
- JUDGE MACE: Thank you. A number of people
- 25 are not counsel in this case, they're not lawyers,

- 1 and that's fine. The main purposes of this
- 2 proceeding is to discuss the bench requests that the
- 3 Commission issued on December 3rd, and also to
- 4 discuss the availability of the Turner Price Index.
- 5 I'm just going to briefly go through some
- 6 items here that relate to those issues and then we'll
- 7 begin.
- 8 On November 30th, the Commission sent out to
- 9 Verizon a request for the Turner Price Index.
- 10 Verizon responded with a December 2nd filing, but it
- 11 appears that that does not meet the needs of the
- 12 Commission to -- in its deliberations in this case,
- 13 and we need to request some further information of
- 14 Verizon about the Turner Price Index. So that will
- 15 be one item that we'll cover today.
- 16 With regard to Bench Request Number 22, it's
- 17 a fairly lengthy request, and we have Dr. Gabel and
- 18 Mr. Burns, his associate, here today to respond to
- 19 questions about the request, if there are any, and of
- 20 course also questions about the Turner Price Index.
- 21 The bench request itself is pretty
- 22 self-explanatory, but there may be questions that you
- 23 have about it. And the things that we're going to
- 24 need to know are when you would be able to have that
- 25 information, if not by December 10th, although we

- 1 hope that you can have it to us by December 10th, and
- 2 I'm addressing Verizon in that respect.
- 3 With regard to Bench Request 23, I want to
- 4 give my apologies to the parties. What went out to
- 5 you as Bench Request 23 was a foreshortened version
- 6 of it, and I'm going to read now what I think should
- 7 have been in the bench request: Please provide the
- 8 adjustment files created by AT&T Witness Turner in VZ
- 9 Cost and referred to in his testimony. Please
- 10 include complete, detailed information describing how
- 11 he made the adjustments to the model. Since Mr.
- 12 Turner's changes may reside on Verizon's computer
- 13 network, this response may require the parties to
- 14 coordinate with each other to provide the
- 15 information.
- 16 Similar to what I just talked about with
- 17 regard to Bench Request 22, if there are any
- 18 questions about the request or any problems with it,
- 19 we'll discuss those, too. Is there anything that I
- 20 should address before we continue with this agenda?
- 21 Any items that anyone wants to bring up? All right.
- 22 With regard to the Turner Price Index, Dr.
- 23 Gabel, I'm going to ask you to talk about that
- 24 briefly, and to talk about the response that you saw
- 25 from Verizon and any problems that you perceive with

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- 1 it.
- DR. GABEL: Okay. In 960369, I asked GTE to
- 3 provide me with a copy of the Turner Price Index, and
- 4 the Turner Price Index that was provided in that
- 5 proceeding provided a price index for a number of
- 6 years, maybe 10 or 15 years for every investment
- 7 sub-account.
- 8 What was identified in Verizon's response to
- 9 the bench request was the current to book cost ratio,
- 10 and as I understand the current to book cost ratio,
- 11 that is constructed using the Turner Price Index by
- 12 applying the Turner Price Indexes to the investments
- 13 that are made each year and aggregating those
- 14 products and dividing them by embedded costs in order
- 15 to get the Turner Price Index.
- But this is what I was expecting to see,
- 17 based upon what GTE had provided me in 960369, with
- 18 an index which said, for example, if the price index
- 19 for digital switching machine was 100 in 1994, it
- 20 might be 101 in 1995, in '98, 1996, and a similar
- 21 string of numbers for all accounts and also for a
- 22 number of years.
- MS. RONIS: Dr. Gabel, this is Catherine
- 24 Ronis. We do have that raw data, because, as you
- 25 just said, it goes into the CC to BC. We gave you

- 1 what we thought you needed to then run our model.
- 2 And Marsha proceeded on to explain how -- and maybe
- 3 you have your own ideas of what you're going to do --
- 4 how just putting the raw Turner indexes in our model
- 5 probably isn't going to do anything.
- 6 So maybe it was our confusion over what you
- 7 intended to do with our model using this information.
- 8 And we apologize if we weren't responsive, but we
- 9 thought we were giving you the next step that then
- 10 would be used in our model. But we do have the raw
- 11 data and can provide that to you.
- DR. GABEL: Is that in your work papers,
- 13 filed work papers? I guess the question -- I don't
- 14 really want to explain what I'm going to do with it.
- MS. RONIS: Okay. No, we can provide that
- 16 today by e-mail.
- 17 DR. GABEL: All right. Thank you.
- MS. RONIS: So you don't -- I mean, Ms.
- 19 Prosini can explain what can and cannot be then used
- 20 in our model, but we can hold off on that. I think
- 21 it would be important.
- DR. GABEL: Well, if Ms. Prosini wants to
- 23 explain that, that's fine with me. I just don't want
- 24 to explain what I intend to do, because that really
- 25 involves what the Commission -- well, anyway. I

- 1 don't want to explain that.
- JUDGE MACE: Right, I don't want us to be
- 3 discussing --
- 4 MS. RONIS: No, and I'm not asking -- I'm
- 5 not asking for that. Why don't we just move on to
- 6 the next subject, then.
- 7 JUDGE MACE: Well, a couple of things. Hold
- 8 on. Just a second. We have to remember, there's a
- 9 court reporter here, and so it's helpful if we don't
- 10 sort of jump on each other's answers in our talking
- 11 here today. Otherwise, the court reporter can't make
- 12 a record.
- I'm confused, because I understood that Ms.
- 14 Prosini was going to address what can and cannot be
- 15 done with the Turner Price Index raw data at this
- 16 point. Dr. Gabel, is that what you would want to
- 17 hear at this point?
- DR. GABEL: Yes.
- JUDGE MACE: Ms. Prosini?
- 20 MS. PROSINI: Yes. The Turner Price Index
- 21 is used in a very small part of the study. It's not
- 22 actually an input to the model at all. The table,
- 23 there is a table in VZ Cost with the TPIs in there,
- 24 but it's not used at all in the study at all. It's
- 25 used only in the calculation of the CC to BC ratios,

- 1 which are really used only to calculate the support
- 2 investments in the factored development.
- 3 JUDGE MACE: But Verizon can provide the
- 4 actual raw data of the Turner Price Index today; is
- 5 that correct?
- 6 MS. PROSINI: That's correct.
- 7 JUDGE MACE: And to all the parties and to
- 8 the Commission by e-mail; is that correct?
- 9 MS. RONIS: Yes, it is proprietary, so we'll
- 10 send it to those who've signed the third proprietary
- 11 agreement.
- DR. GABEL: And the years of the index will
- 13 be --
- 14 JUDGE MACE: Hold on just a moment. Hold on
- 15 just a moment. We're having a little trouble picking
- 16 up the interchange that just took place. I think Dr.
- 17 Gabel asked what years the Turner Price Index data
- 18 would cover?
- 19 DR. GABEL: Yes.
- 20 JUDGE MACE: And Ms. Ronis, you were going
- 21 to respond?
- 22 MS. RONIS: 1946 through 2002.
- DR. GABEL: It's not available for later
- 24 years?
- MS. RONIS: Marsha, do you know?

- 1 MS. PROSINI: We actually -- we purchased
- 2 that from a service that develops the numbers. They
- 3 develop it in the first quarter of each year, and
- 4 that's the latest one available.
- 5 JUDGE MACE: Dr. Gabel, do you have any
- 6 concerns about that?
- 7 DR. GABEL: They can only provide what they
- 8 have.
- 9 JUDGE MACE: All right. Then I'll expect
- 10 that Verizon will be sending that out via e-mail
- 11 today. What I would like to see Verizon do is make
- 12 that a filing, an electronic filing with the
- 13 Commission so that that comes into the Record Center.
- 14 Ms. Ronis?
- MS. RONIS: Yes, we will do that.
- 16 JUDGE MACE: All right. Thank you. Let's
- 17 turn next to the question of Bench Request Number 22.
- 18 I think that that request is, again, relatively
- 19 self-explanatory, except that I understand there may
- 20 be some questions about it, so I'd ask Ms. Ronis
- 21 whether or not Verizon will be able to provide that
- 22 by the 10th, provide the information requested in
- 23 that bench request by the 10th of December?
- MS. RONIS: We will be able to provide much
- of it by CD on Tuesday, because it has to come from

- 1 Verizon, then to me, and then we make the copies and
- 2 then send them out to the service list. We're going
- 3 to get that out by Monday night.
- 4 And there is a portion of the request,
- 5 though, that we won't be able to complete and get
- 6 copies made for another week, and we intend to do
- 7 that on the 22nd. I can list in an e-mail which
- 8 portions will be coming next Tuesday versus the week
- 9 later, or I can do it now, but --
- 10 JUDGE MACE: How lengthy -- sorry.
- 11 MS. RONIS: A lot of it will be coming next
- 12 week, and then the rest the week after.
- 13 JUDGE MACE: How lengthy is the list of what
- 14 you -- which is the shorter list, what you can or
- 15 can't provide by the 14th?
- 16 MS. RONIS: I'm looking at it now. Just
- 17 looking at your list, looks like slightly more items
- on the December 22nd deadline, but in terms of
- 19 volume, like, we'll be able to get all the training
- 20 materials requested out by next week.
- JUDGE MACE: Can you go through the items?
- 22 I believe there are 18 items. I know that it will
- 23 take a little bit of time, but I'd like to have that
- 24 information on the record if I could. If you could
- 25 go through the items one-by-one and just tell us

- 1 which date you'll be providing them?
- 2 MS. RONIS: Okay. First, this is on the
- 3 first page, the training materials.
- 4 JUDGE MACE: Is it Item Number One?
- 5 MS. RONIS: Yes.
- 6 JUDGE MACE: Oh, well, I guess -- hold on.
- 7 It would be Part One?
- 8 MS. RONIS: Right.
- 9 JUDGE MACE: Before you get to the numbers.
- 10 Okay. Go ahead.
- 11 MS. RONIS: That will be provided on
- 12 December 14th.
- JUDGE MACE: Go ahead.
- MS. RONIS: And then number one, the
- 15 adjustments to maximum fiber and copper cable size
- 16 request, that would be provided on December 22nd.
- 17 And then I'm moving to Number 2. Is everyone with
- 18 me?
- 19 JUDGE MACE: Go ahead.
- 20 MS. RONIS: That would be provided on
- 21 December 14th. That would cover all those subparts
- in Number 2.
- Number 3 would be provided on December 14th.
- 24 Number 4 would be provided on December 22nd. Number
- 25 5 would be provided on December 22nd. Number 6 would

- 1 be provided on December 22nd. Number 7 would be
- 2 provided on December 22nd. Number 8 would be
- 3 provided on December 22nd. Number 9 would be
- 4 provided on December 22nd. Number 10 would be
- 5 provided on December 22nd, and Number 11 would be
- 6 provided on December 22nd.
- 7 Number 12 would be provided on December
- 8 14th. Number 13 would be provided on December 22nd.
- 9 Numbers 14, 15 and 16 would be provided on December
- 10 14th. Number 17 would be provided on December 22nd,
- 11 and Number 18 would be provided on December 22nd.
- 12 And then, as to Part Two, that would be
- 13 provided on December 14th, and Part Three would be
- 14 provided on December 22nd.
- JUDGE MACE: Dr. Gabel, you've heard the
- 16 schedule. Do you have any concerns?
- 17 DR. GABEL: I do.
- JUDGE MACE: Go ahead.
- 19 DR. GABEL: Well, I'm a little reluctant to
- 20 talk about them --
- JUDGE MACE: Okay.
- DR. GABEL: -- in this hearing.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. You and I will
- 24 discuss the schedule after.
- DR. GABEL: And maybe you want to just take

- 1 a brief recess and we can talk offline for a minute
- 2 or two.
- JUDGE MACE: Why don't I go ahead with Bench
- 4 Request Number 23, and then we'll take a brief
- 5 adjournment, and you and I will discuss it.
- 6 DR. GABEL: Okay.
- 7 JUDGE MACE: With regard to Bench Request
- 8 Number 23, let me turn first to AT&T. Mr. -- Mr.
- 9 Kopta, are you --
- 10 MR. KOPTA: Yes, Your Honor. Just for the
- 11 benefit of Mr. Turner, who will be the one actually
- 12 compiling the information and I presume working with
- 13 Verizon to the extent necessary, would you read the
- 14 full bench request, which I'm assuming is the
- 15 official bench request, as opposed to the one
- 16 sentence that's in the notice?
- 17 JUDGE MACE: Please provide the adjustment
- 18 files created by AT&T Witness Turner in VZ Cost and
- 19 referred to in his, Mr. Turner's, testimony. Please
- 20 include complete, detailed information describing how
- 21 he made the adjustments to the model. Since Mr.
- 22 Turner's changes may reside on Verizon's computer
- 23 network, this response may require the parties to
- 24 coordinate with each other to provide the
- 25 information.

- 1 MR. KOPTA: And that would be the request,
- 2 rather than what's in the notice. Is my
- 3 understanding correct?
- 4 JUDGE MACE: That's my understanding. If
- 5 there is any lack of clarity or any problem about
- 6 this particular request, I'd turn to Dr. Gabel and
- 7 ask if this covers the information that he's seeking
- 8 here?
- 9 DR. GABEL: Yes, what Judge Mace just read
- 10 is what we're seeking, so where there is a number of
- 11 issues that Mr. Turner addressed in his testimony,
- 12 it's not always apparent to me how he implemented
- 13 those concepts in VZ Cost, and so that's what I'm
- 14 seeking from him, is guidance when he identified an
- 15 issue, how did he modify the inputs to the model in a
- 16 way that was consistent with his representation in
- 17 his testimony about the issue that he was concerned
- 18 about.
- 19 MR. KOPTA: Okay. At this point I will ask
- 20 Mr. Turner if he has any questions or needs any
- 21 clarification of what's being requested.
- MR. TURNER: Well, unfortunately, the
- 23 document that I had, and it sounds like, Greg, the
- 24 document you had describing the bench request, what
- 25 has now been read to us over the phone here is a

- 1 little bit more elaborate, and I do have just a
- 2 couple of questions.
- 3 One is would you need, then -- if I
- 4 understand what you're asking, are you seeking, then,
- 5 like an explanation for each change that's in an
- 6 input table to VZ Loop that we made, what the basis
- 7 for that change was?
- 8 DR. GABEL: Not what the basis was, but just
- 9 where would we -- where did you go in VZ Cost to make
- 10 the change and what was the change that you put into
- 11 the input files?
- 12 MR. TURNER: Okay. So for each -- in other
- 13 words, for each thing that's discussed in my
- 14 testimony, where is that change implemented in VZ
- 15 Loop and what was the change that was implemented?
- DR. GABEL: Yes, yes. So you were prepared
- 17 to address the Hatfield model, so let me give you an
- 18 analogy. So you would say to me, in the Hatfield
- 19 model, Well, I went to such and such folder and in
- 20 cell H13, I changed the value from .5 to .4. I'm
- 21 looking for some comparable guidance within the VZ
- 22 Cost model.
- 23 MR. TURNER: Okay. I think I understand
- 24 what you're looking for, and so -- and you would like
- 25 that -- are you wanting that connected back to the

- 1 testimony that I filed? In other words, what I'm not
- 2 sure of the linkage -- I can go through the changes
- 3 in the tables, but it seems to me that you're also
- 4 looking for a linkage back to where the issue is
- 5 described in the testimony down to where I actually
- 6 made changes into the tables in VZ Loop.
- 7 DR. GABEL: Yes, I'm looking for that
- 8 linkage. So for example, if you testified on the
- 9 issue of loop utilization, you would say, Loop
- 10 utilization, I went to this folder and this cell and
- 11 made this change.
- MR. TURNER: Okay. I understand the
- 13 request.
- 14 JUDGE MACE: And Mr. Turner, you will be
- 15 able to provide that information to us? We don't --
- 16 do we need to have some information from Verizon,
- 17 also, in order to obtain the information from you?
- 18 MR. TURNER: Well, I have Dave Cook here on
- 19 the line. When we -- my understanding of the bench
- 20 request was that Dr. Gabel was also wanting to have
- 21 access to the actual modified tables that are
- 22 contained inside of VZ Cost that we had changed. And
- 23 there has -- since our Washington filing, there has
- 24 been an improvement that has been made by Verizon in
- 25 terms of allowing parties to be able to have access

- 1 to the tables. And it appears to me that, Dr. Gabel,
- 2 you would still want to have access to that, if I'm
- 3 understanding properly what you're seeking. Is that
- 4 correct, the actual modified tables inside of VZ
- 5 Cost?
- 6 DR. GABEL: I'm going to ask for assistance
- 7 here from Steven Burns. Steven?
- 8 MR. BURNS: Yes, that information would be
- 9 helpful.
- 10 MR. TURNER: Okay. We -- Dave Cook is on
- 11 the line, because I believe we are able to do that,
- 12 but we may need to work with Verizon, to some extent,
- 13 to actually make those available to the Commission
- 14 Staff IDs. And if you have any specific questions
- 15 about that, we can talk about that now, but I don't
- 16 believe it is -- if not extraordinary assistance,
- 17 it's just -- I believe they have to make a change
- 18 inside of VZ Cost that would actually allow any IDs
- 19 inside the Commission Staff's use to actually be able
- 20 to access our tables once we publish a filing.
- 21 MS. RONIS: Yeah, this is Catherine Ronis.
- 22 Pam Beinar's on to address this very issue. We can
- 23 work it offline or, Pam, I don't know if you have a
- 24 quick reaction or comment to what was just said.
- MS. BEINAR: Can everybody hear me?

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- 1 MS. RONIS: Yes.
- JUDGE MACE: We can hear you in the hearing
- 3 room.
- 4 MS. BEINAR: In summary, we have a couple of
- 5 options, depending on the number of tables or partial
- 6 tables. I can work that offline with Mr. Turner or
- 7 -- to save time, but yes, we can provide that, but I
- 8 would need the names of the tables and to set them up
- 9 so that a selected group can see them.
- 10 MS. RONIS: Okay. So it doesn't look like
- 11 that is going to be a problem at all.
- 12 JUDGE MACE: Well, let me just interject
- 13 here. I'm a little concerned about offline with Mr.
- 14 Turner. One of the problems is to try to make this
- 15 as transparent as possible so that any party that
- 16 wants to see the information that's being provided,
- 17 who signed the appropriate agreements to do so, can
- 18 view what's happening here. If you're offline with
- 19 Mr. Turner, does that preclude that information being
- 20 disseminated?
- 21 MS. RONIS: One idea -- this is Catherine.
- 22 One idea would be for anyone who wants to view those
- 23 tables, as Dr. Gabel and Mr. Burns will be doing, to
- 24 notify us, and they would be given access just like
- 25 Dr. Gabel and Mr. Burns. I don't know if people in

- 1 the room are ready now to say yes and to give us some
- 2 information or want to e-mail me or whether we want
- 3 to have a follow-up call, whatever you prefer, but
- 4 that doesn't -- it's not a problem if AT&T's willing
- 5 to give access to their files to everybody. Sounds
- 6 like they are.
- 7 JUDGE MACE: Is that correct, Mr. Turner, or
- 8 Mr. Kopta?
- 9 MR. TURNER: Well, I should probably have
- 10 Mr. Kopta answer that.
- MR. KOPTA: Well, obviously, you know, we
- 12 have some concern here in terms of work product, and
- 13 if we're talking about the tables that Mr. Turner
- 14 actually relied on for his testimony, we have no
- 15 objection. If it goes to other tables that might
- 16 have been prepared in terms of evaluating the model
- 17 or were used in a way that were not part of the
- 18 testimony, then that we would have a problem with.
- 19 But it sounds to me as though the data
- 20 request or the bench request is directed only to
- 21 those tables that were used in preparing the
- 22 testimony in which Mr. Turner relied. And as to
- 23 those, we would not have an objection to other
- 24 people, as well as Dr. Gabel, having access to those.
- DR. GABEL: Mr. Kopta's correct.

- 1 JUDGE MACE: This is Dr. Gabel.
- DR. GABEL: Mr. Kopta's correct that we're
- 3 only interested in seeing the work files associated
- 4 with the testimony.
- 5 MR. KOPTA: On that basis, we don't have any
- 6 objection to other parties, to the extent that they
- 7 have signed the appropriate protective agreements,
- 8 also having access to that data, since it is, in our
- 9 view, you know, related or part of the testimony that
- 10 we filed in this case.
- JUDGE MACE: Let me try to inquire now of
- 12 other parties on the line, besides Verizon and AT&T,
- 13 whether they want to be a part of the sharing of this
- 14 information. Ms. Frame?
- MS. FRAME: Yes, Your Honor. No, Covad
- doesn't feel a need to be a part of it at this point.
- JUDGE MACE: Thank you. Ms. Smith.
- MS. SMITH: No, Your Honor.
- 19 JUDGE MACE: No, Staff indicates that they
- 20 don't need to be a part of this either. Just so I
- 21 have a complete understanding, then, when will this
- 22 process take place? Can this process take place by
- 23 December 10th?
- MR. TURNER: Well, I had been asked by --
- JUDGE MACE: This is Mr. Turner, right?

- 1 MR. TURNER: This is Mr. Turner, yes. I had
- 2 been asked by Mr. Kopta and Ms. Baker, of AT&T, as to
- 3 whether or not we could have this work completed by
- 4 Friday. And I cannot speak for Verizon, but our
- 5 experience has been that taking the tables that are
- 6 inside of VZ Loop and VZ Cost, putting them into a
- 7 filing that could then be accessible by Dr. Gabel is
- 8 something that we could readily have done by Friday,
- 9 which would be, I believe, your December 10th date.
- 10 JUDGE MACE: Correct.
- MR. TURNER: And the only complication here
- 12 is that, based on what I had read the bench request
- 13 was, I thought that was the extent of what was being
- 14 sought, so I conveyed to Ms. Baker and Mr. Kopta that
- 15 we could have that done by Friday.
- 16 The description that was read today as to
- 17 what this bench request is seeking in terms of a
- 18 cross-reference of my testimony into each of the
- 19 changes that were made in the tables, that is a work
- 20 product that does not exist and it's one that will
- 21 require me to give some thought to how long it would
- 22 take to create it. And it's -- again, I just did not
- 23 know that that was what was being sought till we got
- 24 on this conference, so I hesitate to give you a time
- 25 estimate right now without first sitting down and

- 1 giving some thought to how much work this is going to
- 2 take to actually create that cross-reference.
- 3 MR. KOPTA: This is Greg Kopta. Might I
- 4 suggest something? And Dr. Gabel, let me know if
- 5 this isn't acceptable, but one thing we might
- 6 consider doing is allowing or setting it up so that
- 7 you can have access to the tables and the corrections
- 8 or the revisions to the model that Mr. Turner made,
- 9 and to the extent that it's not apparent what the
- 10 changes were and why they were made, then if you
- 11 could issue or maybe perhaps seek follow-up in terms
- 12 of how certain things were done, rather than kind of
- 13 a blanket how did you do everything.
- 14 Would that suit your purposes, or do you
- 15 really need the soup to nuts?
- DR. GABEL: well, the VZ Cost has -- what
- 17 you will provide me, will it have something
- 18 equivalent to what's in the Hatfield model that says
- 19 here are all the changes that were made in this
- 20 scenario?
- MR. KOPTA: Mr. Turner?
- MR. TURNER: I don't believe -- this is Mr.
- 23 Turner speaking, of course. I don't believe -- the
- 24 answer to that is no.
- DR. GABEL: So in that case, Mr. Kopta, it's

- 1 going to be pretty hard for me to just trace through
- 2 all of his files and identify the changes that he
- 3 made.
- 4 MR. KOPTA: Well, I was just -- this is Mr.
- 5 Kopta again. I was just trying to see if there was
- 6 some way we could short-circuit this, but if there
- 7 isn't a way, then we just need to do what we can do.
- 8 MR. TURNER: Right. And the only reason --
- 9 this is Steve Turner speaking again. The only reason
- 10 I'm hesitating, Greg, to immediately identify a time
- 11 is it's been a bit of time since this case, we had
- 12 the hearing. I've got to go back and -- I just don't
- 13 -- it sounds to me like this could be quite a bit of
- 14 work to actually produce a linkage from a section of
- 15 the testimony to what the number was in Verizon's
- 16 filing to what our number was.
- I don't believe I need to then explain why
- 18 the change, but I heard that that was possibly a
- 19 request, as well, why the change was made to be
- 20 consistent with what's in the testimony, but that
- 21 could be a fair amount of work, and I just would need
- 22 to go through my records to compile that for Dr.
- 23 Gabel, and I just don't know how much time that would
- 24 take, just sitting here right now. The bench request
- 25 that was e-mailed to me was much briefer than that

- 1 request.
- JUDGE MACE: Mr. Turner, and my apologies.
- 3 What was to have gone out was to have been the longer
- 4 version, but in the haste of trying to get it out,
- 5 there was a slip. So again, my apologies about that.
- In any event, I need to confer with Dr.
- 7 Gabel about the timing of the provision of this
- 8 information, but I need to find out from you, is
- 9 there a chance that you would be able to have this
- 10 information, for example, by December 14th?
- DR. GABEL: Judge Mace, before he responds,
- 12 let me just provide clarification --
- JUDGE MACE: Sure. Go ahead.
- DR. GABEL: -- on what Mr. Turner just said.
- 15 I'm not asking for why; I'm just asking for linkage.
- 16 I just want you to identify the linkage between
- 17 changes made to the inputs to the Verizon cost model
- 18 and where that topic was identified in your
- 19 testimony.
- 20 MR. TURNER: Right, and you know, the
- 21 specifics of this could -- there are hundreds and
- 22 thousands of changes. Some of these I'll be able to
- 23 address globally, but the -- and I understand you're
- 24 not asking for an explanation; it's just that there
- 25 is a very large number of changes to a very large

- 1 number of tables that you're asking -- and I'm not
- 2 saying that the request isn't, you know, something
- 3 that would be helpful for you in facilitating why or
- 4 what -- the linkages back to testimony to why things
- 5 were changed, but it's just a work product that I
- 6 don't have consolidated into a document right now.
- 7 And you know, the provisions -- or the
- 8 providing of the tables to you and your ability to
- 9 access it, those tables that we actually used in our
- 10 filing, is something that Verizon has actually
- 11 created a mechanism to allow that to happen, and I'm
- 12 not trying to over -- you know, overstate this, but
- 13 they've actually created a mechanism that's fairly
- 14 simple to do that.
- 15 But the other is what I would characterize
- 16 as a new work product, and sitting here right now, I
- 17 don't -- I don't know if that could be done by the
- 18 14th, either, but I, you know, I will -- if you have
- 19 to have an answer on the call right now, I don't know
- 20 what to say, but what I plan to do is, after the
- 21 call, is to talk with Mr. Kopta and Ms. Baker and
- 22 confer as to -- I need to do some research on my own
- 23 just to figure out how much work this would be, and
- 24 then I'm sure that we would be able to convey that
- 25 back to you guys.

- JUDGE MACE: Well, I'm going to -- again, I
- 2 will confer with Dr. Gabel. We do need to have some
- 3 sort of a deadline, and I think we need to have it
- 4 today. It may be that there will have to be some
- 5 slippage of that deadline, but I do want to put
- 6 something on the record today, before we finish up,
- 7 that will let us know at least a target date.
- 8 So you -- let's not deal with it anymore
- 9 right now. I would like to talk with Dr. Gabel
- 10 separately. Is there anything else that we should
- 11 address?
- MS. RONIS: Yes, yes, this is Catherine
- 13 Ronis. I might as well raise this now, because it
- 14 may be relevant to your discussion with Dr. Gabel.
- 15 That is, as we talked about during the training in --
- 16 I think it was June, during the hearing, we think it
- 17 would be a good idea to perhaps do -- walk through
- 18 with Dr. Gabel how to make changes, whether he wants
- 19 to give us specific changes he's thinking of making
- 20 or not. We think that would be helpful and we, of
- 21 course, can do it anywhere the parties would like and
- 22 all parties could attend, but given the amount of
- 23 time that has elapsed, we think that would be very
- 24 useful to do.
- 25 And so we're offering that up, and we can go

- 1 wherever Dr. Gabel or the Commission would like us to
- 2 go, and it may short-circuit, I think, a lot of this,
- 3 and we could do it all sitting down, exactly how you
- 4 make a change and what you do and what the various
- 5 steps are. So we're offering that up. And we could
- 6 do it this month, we could do it, you know, next
- 7 week. So that may expedite some things.
- 8 JUDGE MACE: Anything else? All right. Dr.
- 9 Gabel?
- DR. GABEL: Yes.
- JUDGE MACE: I'm going to call you
- 12 separately, if that's all right, and I'd like the
- 13 other parties to stay on the line. And if you were
- 14 in the hearing room, this would be just a brief
- 15 adjournment while I confer off the record and out of
- 16 the room. If you'll just stay on the line, I'll be
- 17 back shortly.
- 18 MS. RONIS: This is Catherine again. I'm
- 19 sorry to do this. There's one additional fact I
- 20 should make --
- JUDGE MACE: Sure.
- 22 MS. RONIS: -- point I should make before
- 23 you break. And that is, you may recall that we did
- 24 file, of course, in June of '03. And then, in
- 25 January of '04, we did an updated filing in which we

- 1 filed an updated version of the VZ Loop model, and
- 2 then we actually filed another version closer to the
- 3 hearing based on some data requests, is that correct,
- 4 and that's Version -- what we refer to as 7RA, and
- 5 those are the versions that are available on the web
- 6 right now.
- 7 So we are assuming, Dr. Gabel, that you will
- 8 be using those versions as VZ Loop. And the reason I
- 9 raise this is, of course, some of the other studies
- 10 are still using the initial versions, so in terms of
- 11 going back and forth, depending on which model or
- 12 study you're going to use, you know, we need to be
- 13 very careful in documenting how you would do that,
- 14 and we will document that, but that, again, may be
- 15 another reason it makes sense to walk through this in
- 16 person.
- JUDGE MACE: Dr. Gabel?
- 18 DR. GABEL: We'll discuss this offline and
- 19 then --
- MS. RONIS: Okay.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. We're adjourned.
- 22 (Recess taken.)
- JUDGE MACE: Thank you for your patience.
- 24 Well, there was one more item I wanted to take care
- of off the record, but I'm not going to do that right

- 1 now. Mr. Burns, are you back on?
- 2 MR. BURNS: Yes, I am.
- JUDGE MACE: And Dr. Gabel? Okay. We've
- 4 obviously spent some time conferring about the
- 5 schedule for providing information, and we wish we
- 6 would have been able to get it sooner than Verizon is
- 7 able to have it, but we recognize that there's quite
- 8 a bit of information that's being requested here,
- 9 too, so we need to ask a couple of questions. Dr.
- 10 Gabel, is that you?
- DR. GABEL: Yes.
- 12 JUDGE MACE: Okay. Thank you. We need to
- 13 ask a couple of questions in light of the offer of
- 14 Verizon to conduct a tutorial.
- Ms. Ronis, if Verizon were to conduct a
- 16 tutorial, let's say next week in Boston, on
- 17 Wednesday, would that have any impact on your
- 18 provision of the information on the dates you said
- 19 you'd provide it?
- 20 MS. RONIS: No, we would still be able to
- 21 meet those same dates.
- JUDGE MACE: Thank you. I want to stay with
- 23 the subject for a minute, because I know that a
- 24 question of the tutorial and its location came up
- 25 earlier in this proceeding, and some parties had some

- 1 difficulty with attending the tutorial that was
- 2 scheduled and located in a place other than the state
- 3 of Washington.
- 4 Because of the time parameters we have here
- 5 and Dr. Gabel's and Mr. Burns' availability, it
- 6 appears that the tutorial would be beneficial, but
- 7 that the best thing to do would be to schedule it on
- 8 the East Coast.
- 9 Is there any objection from the parties to
- 10 holding a tutorial in Boston, and hopefully next
- 11 week, but we'll have to find out about that from
- 12 Verizon. Can I ask now, for example, Staff, whether
- 13 you have any objection to that?
- MS. SMITH: May we confer, Your Honor?
- JUDGE MACE: Surely. While you're
- 16 conferring, I'll talk to AT&T. Mr. Kopta. Mr.
- 17 Kopta?
- 18 MR. KOPTA: Would there be telephone access
- 19 so that we wouldn't have to actually travel to
- 20 Boston?
- JUDGE MACE: Okay. Well, then, let's put
- 22 the ball in Verizon's court. Let me ask, number one,
- 23 Ms. Ronis, if Verizon would be able to provide a
- 24 tutorial on the East Coast next week?
- MS. RONIS: I am sure next week will be

- 1 fine, and we will do all we can to make sure that
- 2 Wednesday works. I just need to call some people,
- 3 and some of whom may not be there right now, because
- 4 it's 6:00 East Coast time, to make sure, but I do
- 5 think we can make it work. We'll just have to make
- 6 it work. We can provide a bridge and perhaps even a
- 7 video conference with web access or something along
- 8 those lines. I can send an e-mail tomorrow with more
- 9 detail.
- 10 JUDGE MACE: I'm not sure Staff was aware,
- 11 but Ms. Ronis just responded that Verizon would be
- 12 exploring providing a bridge and a video conference
- 13 link to the tutorial.
- MS. SMITH: If there is a bridge, we
- 15 wouldn't have an objection. If there's -- if there's
- 16 no conference bridge or video conference or other
- 17 means available, then we would object, because I
- 18 cannot arrange that travel in my schedule, nor can
- 19 Mr. Spinks, so without that assurance, then we
- 20 object.
- 21 MS. RONIS: This is Catherine. We
- 22 absolutely can do an audio conference, and now that
- 23 my firm has merged with a big Boston firm, I'm sure
- 24 we can provide video conference, and then possibly
- 25 even web access, so -- which allows you to follow

- 1 actually what's being done on the screen in the room.
- 2 That last piece I need to verify, so --
- JUDGE MACE: I'm sorry. Go ahead.
- 4 MS. RONIS: I'm certain we can do both video
- 5 and audio.
- JUDGE MACE: Mr. Kopta.
- 7 MR. KOPTA: I think, under those
- 8 circumstances, we would be okay with it.
- 9 JUDGE MACE: All right. When can we know
- 10 whether or not you can do such a conference on
- 11 Wednesday in Boston, or such a tutorial?
- MS. RONIS: By tomorrow noon your time,
- 13 perhaps earlier.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. By tomorrow noon.
- 15 You'll advise me and advise me of the details, you
- 16 know, where and et cetera?
- MS. RONIS: Right.
- 18 JUDGE MACE: Also, please advise me exactly
- 19 what will be available in terms of audio conference,
- 20 video, web access, et cetera.
- 21 MS. RONIS: I will do it now.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. Thank you. Then
- 23 the information that pertains to Bench Request 22,
- 24 you'll provide on the 14th of December and the 22nd
- of December, as you indicated. If there is any

- 1 possibility that, at the tutorial, you have provided
- 2 adequate explanation so that Mr. Burns and Dr. Gabel
- 3 don't need some of the information that would have
- 4 been provided on the 22nd, they'll advise me and I'll
- 5 advise you of that so that you're not burdened with
- 6 providing that information unnecessarily.
- 7 MS. RONIS: Thank you.
- 8 JUDGE MACE: I have a couple of other items
- 9 I need to address. Ms. Beinar indicated that she
- 10 could provide Mr. Turner's files to Dr. Gabel. And
- 11 Ms. Beinar, when can you provide those?
- MS. BEINAR: I would need a list of the
- 13 tables that they would like to have shared and then,
- 14 based on the time frame I receive those tables, I
- 15 would need approximately 24 hours to make them
- 16 available.
- 17 MR. TURNER: This is Mr. Turner. If I could
- 18 just ask a brief question before pursuing this too
- 19 far? In Exhibit SET-3 to my testimony, we provided
- 20 on CD-ROM a copy of all the input tables that we have
- 21 modified, as well as all the output tables that were
- 22 modified by our runs and provided those in
- 23 directories entitled Restated Loop Input Files and
- 24 Restated Loop Output Files.
- 25 And my question was -- is because of the

- 1 other request that I'm going to be doing, it would
- 2 seem to me -- and those input files correspond to
- 3 equivalent input files that Verizon also utilized.
- 4 Their CSV files comma -- I believe that stands for
- 5 comma separated values files, but when you open them
- 6 up in Excel, they look pretty much like normal Excel
- 7 files.
- 8 But my question was is there something about
- 9 those that are not sufficient? Because it would
- 10 actually facilitate the work product that Dr. Gabel's
- 11 asked me to do in response to Number 23 if those were
- 12 sufficient. And I raise the question, too, because
- 13 it may be easier to just utilize those files than
- 14 having Verizon have to do this additional day of
- 15 work. I wanted to at least ask that before we
- 16 proceeded further.
- JUDGE MACE: Dr. Gabel?
- 18 DR. GABEL: I'd have to defer to Mr. Burns.
- JUDGE MACE: Mr. Burns.
- 20 MR. BURNS: Mr. Turner, so these -- the CSV
- 21 files, these are the ones that you say you downloaded
- 22 the template, changed different inputs, and then
- 23 uploaded to adjust your runs; is that correct?
- MR. TURNER: That is exactly right.
- 25 MR. BURNS: Okay. Well, I was wondering,

- 1 are these files still on the VZ Cost system? When
- 2 you go on into the data management, can you filter to
- 3 them?
- 4 MR. TURNER: They would be, yes.
- 5 MR. BURNS: Okay.
- 6 MR. TURNER: I mean, they're the same files
- 7 that we use. We haven't made any changes or anything
- 8 of that nature.
- 9 MR. BURNS: Well, what I was hoping for, if
- 10 Verizon was able to give me access so I could see
- 11 what they filter to, it would save me the trouble of
- 12 uploading them. So it might shorten the time into
- 13 examining them.
- MR. TURNER: Okay.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. So --
- 16 MR. TURNER: You still -- bottom line is you
- 17 would like to have access to them in the VZ Cost
- 18 environment. That's fine. I just wanted it at
- 19 least pointed out that they were there, but that's --
- 20 that's fine.
- 21 MS. RONIS: I think -- this is Catherine.
- 22 So Steve Turner, we need, I guess, a list of files
- 23 from you, and Pam, you need a day to then create
- 24 separate stand-alone kind of environment for then Dr.
- 25 Gabel and Mr. Burns to access?

- 1 MS. BEINAR: Yes.
- 2 MR. TURNER: And I'm going to have Dave Cook
- 3 work with Pam for that, but I believe --
- 4 JUDGE MACE: Now, Mr. Turner -- that's Mr.
- 5 Turner; right?
- 6 MR. TURNER: Yes.
- 7 JUDGE MACE: Okay. Please introduce
- 8 yourself before you start, so the reporter can know
- 9 who it is. Go ahead.
- 10 MR. TURNER: I'm going to have Dave Cook
- 11 work with Pam on that, but it would seem to me that
- 12 we're going to probably identify all of the files
- 13 that we ended up using, including those that did not
- 14 change, so that Dr. Gabel and -- I apologize, I
- 15 didn't catch the name of the other person that's
- 16 wanting to see the files.
- 17 JUDGE MACE: Steven Burns.
- 18 MR. TURNER: Mr. Burns, so they can actually
- 19 see the entire collection of files that we used to do
- 20 our loop runs. But I'll have Mr. Cook get with
- 21 Pamela Beinar to do that.
- 22 JUDGE MACE: I want to make sure that I have
- 23 an understanding of what's happening here. We have
- 24 two separate things that would be happening. One is
- 25 that Verizon, after it gets the list from you, Mr.

- 1 Turner, would be making tables available to Dr.
- 2 Gabel, and the other thing is that you yourself will
- 3 be providing information to Dr. Gabel.
- 4 MR. TURNER: That's correct. That's the way
- 5 I understand it at this point.
- 6 JUDGE MACE: All right. Then, first of all,
- 7 I want to know when you can have the list to Ms.
- 8 Beinar?
- 9 MR. TURNER: I believe we're going to be
- 10 able to have that list to Ms. Beinar by tomorrow
- 11 afternoon.
- JUDGE MACE: So by 12/9, okay. And Ms.
- 13 Beinar, you can then turn that around by Friday?
- MS. BEINAR: Yes, we'll have it done --
- 15 we'll try to have it done within the 24-hour time
- 16 frame.
- 17 JUDGE MACE: All right. And how is it that
- 18 you're exactly going to provide that? Is -- will
- 19 that come to the parties electronically or will Dr.
- 20 Gabel and Steven Burns then just be able to access VZ
- 21 Cost or VZ Loop?
- MS. BEINAR: Well, I have a couple of
- 23 options. The first option is -- and I'm going back
- 24 to a portion of the discussion that just occurred.
- 25 If the choice is to provide all tables that have been

- 1 used by the third party, then I can provide Dr. Gabel
- 2 and Mr. Burns with an ID as part of the AT&T tables.
- 3 If AT&T would prefer that I only provide selected
- 4 access based on this particular (inaudible), then I
- 5 will create a filing version that will consist of
- 6 only the tables that are in question to avoid any
- 7 additional confusion.
- JUDGE MACE: Dr. Gabel.
- 9 DR. GABEL: I would prefer the latter option
- 10 to avoid confusion.
- MS. BEINAR: All right. That's the route
- 12 that we will choose.
- 13 JUDGE MACE: All right. I want to ask
- 14 another question. When Dr. -- or when Mr. Turner's
- 15 files are made available to Dr. Gabel, will his or
- 16 the Commission's files somehow be made available to
- 17 other people? In other words, will there be a mutual
- 18 sharing?
- 19 MS. BEINAR: By Dr. Gabel or by -- for the
- 20 tables?
- 21 DR. GABEL: This is David Gabel. My concern
- 22 is I want to make sure that the access is one way.
- 23 We have access to Mr. Turner's files, but Mr. Turner
- 24 doesn't immediately have access to our files because
- 25 he has granted us access to his files.

- 1 MS. BEINAR: Yes. And therefore, we will
- 2 set it up in the second choice that I mentioned, so
- 3 that you -- only you will have access to those
- 4 tables.
- DR. GABEL: Okay. And he does not have
- 6 access to our files?
- 7 MS. BEINAR: Right. And I will have to make
- 8 sure that he does not have access to your files.
- 9 MR. KOPTA: Your Honor, this is Greg Kopta.
- 10 In response to your question in terms of access, I
- 11 believe that what Mr. Turner was saying is the tables
- 12 to which we're talking about in terms of access
- 13 within the VZ Loop or VZ Cost models are the same as
- 14 those that are in Mr. Turner's exhibit to his
- 15 testimony.
- 16 So in terms of the substance, Dr. Gabel will
- 17 not have any more information than any other party;
- 18 he will just be able to use it within the model. So
- 19 I guess the question really is, rather than whether
- 20 other parties have the information, is whether other
- 21 parties want to be able to manipulate the model using
- 22 the tables within the model.
- 23 And as I understand from Ms. Frame, who I
- 24 neglected to mention needed to excuse herself, and I
- 25 apologize, she had to leave before you came back, and

- 1 Ms. Smith, it sounds like the other parties that are
- 2 interested at this point would not be interested in
- 3 taking that option.
- 4 JUDGE MACE: Forgive me, Mr. Kopta. I'm not
- 5 exactly sure what you meant.
- 6 MR. KOPTA: Okay. Let me repeat it. The
- 7 substance of the files is the same in Mr. Turner's
- 8 Exhibit SET-3 -- I'm sorry, I don't have the exhibit
- 9 number available to me -- as the files that are in
- 10 the VZ Loop. The only difference between what Dr.
- 11 Gabel is getting and what's already in the record is
- 12 that he and Mr. Burns would have the ability to use
- 13 those files within the Verizon cost model.
- JUDGE MACE: Okay.
- MR. KOPTA: So it's not a question of
- 16 whether people have access to the information; it's a
- 17 question of whether other parties would want to be
- 18 able to use that information as part of the Verizon
- 19 model without having to upload the same files from
- 20 what's in the record currently.
- JUDGE MACE: And are there any parties, any
- 22 that are on the line at this point or in the hearing
- 23 room, who desire that option of being able to
- 24 manipulate the cost model?
- MS. SMITH: Not at this point, Your Honor.

- 1 JUDGE MACE: Ms. Smith says no, as far as
- 2 Staff is concerned. Anyone else? All right. It
- 3 looks like it's the second option, Ms. Beinar, and
- 4 you're going to make sure --
- 5 THE REPORTER: I don't think they can hear
- 6 you when it's blinking red.
- 7 JUDGE MACE: What's the matter? Are people
- 8 hearing what I'm saying?
- 9 MR. KOPTA: There was a long gap there.
- 10 JUDGE MACE: It looks like it's the second
- 11 option, Ms. Beinar, and you're going to facilitate
- 12 that by December 10th, so that Dr. Gabel will -- and
- 13 Mr. Burns will have access to it, and you will
- 14 provide them access according to the second option
- 15 that you described.
- MS. BEINAR: Yes.
- JUDGE MACE: And we're assured, then, with
- 18 that second option, that there won't be any --
- 19 somehow sharing or access to the Commission's own
- 20 files and deliberations with regard to the provision
- 21 of the information.
- 22 MR. TURNER: And this is Steve Turner, just
- 23 asking a quick question. Pam Beinar, they're going
- 24 to have access, but they're not going to be -- the
- 25 run that we did, they're not going to be able to

- 1 change it on our IDs; is that correct?
- 2 MS. BEINAR: That's correct. I'm not going
- 3 to put them into your organization. I'm going to set
- 4 them up a separate filing that they will have access
- 5 to.
- 6 MR. TURNER: You're basically going to copy
- 7 our filing over so that they can have access to it
- 8 under their IDs, but they wouldn't be able to change
- 9 what we have on our IDs?
- 10 MS. BEINAR: Correct.
- 11 MR. TURNER: Okay.
- 12 JUDGE MACE: All right. So that leaves us
- 13 with getting dates from Mr. Turner for the
- 14 information he's going to provide and the question
- 15 about which version of Verizon's cost model Dr. Gabel
- 16 and Mr. Burns want to have access to.
- 17 And my understanding that it is the Version
- 18 7RA. Is that correct, Mr. Burns and Dr. Gabel?
- 19 DR. GABEL: Yes, that's -- Ms. Ronis asked
- 20 us right before we took the break about which version
- 21 we needed access to, and it is the version that you
- 22 identified.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. Thank you.
- MS. RONIS: Thank you.
- 25 MR. BURNS: Theo, I have one question, Steve

- 1 Burns, a question about the access to Mr. Turner's
- 2 files.
- JUDGE MACE: Go ahead.
- 4 MR. BURNS: I understand that Verizon is
- 5 essentially making a copy of the changes he's made
- 6 and we'll have access to them. My question is, in
- 7 the pulldown menu, the owner of the different files,
- 8 the data version filter, will I see these files as --
- 9 will they say Steven Turner there, or will they
- 10 indicate that they're his, or will they just come
- 11 under my name, Dr. Gabel's name, or VZ Cost?
- MS. BEINAR: No, they will reflect the
- 13 original creator, which would be the AT&T. And I
- 14 can't remember exactly what the organization name is
- off the top of my head, but it will show them as the
- 16 owner.
- 17 JUDGE MACE: Is that Ms. Beinar -- hold on,
- 18 hold on. Is that Ms. Beinar who just responded?
- 19 MS. BEINAR: Yes.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. Thank you. Go
- 21 ahead, Mr. Burns.
- 22 MR. BURNS: Okay. I just wanted to be
- 23 certain that the owner would be distinct from files
- 24 that I've created?
- MS. BEINAR: Yes.

- 1 MR. BURNS: Okay. All right.
- DR. GABEL: Judge Mace?
- JUDGE MACE: Go ahead.
- 4 DR. GABEL: David Gabel. I'm sorry, I'm
- 5 going to have to get off.
- 6 JUDGE MACE: All right. Thank you, David.
- 7 DR. GABEL: Okay. Bye.
- JUDGE MACE: I just want to make sure that
- 9 I've covered everything here. Let me just reiterate
- 10 that the Turner Price Index will be provided by the
- 11 close of business today Pacific time. Is that right,
- 12 Ms. Ronis?
- MS. RONIS: Yes.
- 14 JUDGE MACE: That you will advise me by noon
- 15 tomorrow whether or not a tutorial for Dr. Gabel and
- 16 Mr. Burns can be provided on Wednesday next week.
- 17 That's Wednesday, December 15th, in Boston. And you
- 18 will also advise me the nature of the conferencing
- 19 that will be provided for that tutorial.
- MS. RONIS: Yes.
- JUDGE MACE: You will be providing certain
- 22 aspects of Bench Request 22 on December 14th, as you
- 23 described earlier, and certain portions on December
- 24 22nd; is that correct?
- MS. RONIS: Yes.

- 1 JUDGE MACE: And I've noted what those are.
- 2 MS. RONIS: Yes.
- JUDGE MACE: With regard to Bench Request
- 4 23, Ms. Beinar is going to receive the list of files
- 5 or tables that are to be shared by tomorrow, and on
- 6 December 10th, she will have set up an ability for
- 7 Dr. Gabel to have access to those files on the
- 8 Verizon models; is that correct?
- 9 MS. RONIS: That's my understanding. This
- 10 is Catherine.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. Thank you. Now,
- 12 Mr. Turner, the last outstanding item is when you're
- 13 going to be able to have your information to us.
- 14 Have you done any further thought about that? Have
- 15 you thought any further about that?
- MR. TURNER: Yes, I have, and I was going to
- 17 suggest that we would have that to you by the 22nd,
- 18 the -- some of the dates that I heard Verizon's for,
- 19 and it would be, as I described earlier, based on my
- 20 understanding of Dr. Gabel's request, it would
- 21 contain a matrix that would have Verizon's value, our
- 22 alternative value, and then a cross-reference to the
- 23 discussion in our testimony.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. Mr. Turner, if
- 25 there's any chance that you can provide that sooner

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than the 22nd, that would be extremely helpful, but
 1

     I'll accept that date at this point.
