1 By application filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission on the 27th day of June, 2003, Pacific Disposal, Inc., requested extension of authority under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. G-97 to provide:

SOLID WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE in that portion of Thurston County described as follows:

Sections 7 and 8, T16N, R3W.

2 Upon consideration of all the evidence of record, the Commission finds that the applicant is fit, willing and able to properly conduct the proposed operations and that the service sought to be rendered is necessary and will be a convenience to the public.

ORDER

3 WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED That the application herein be and the same is hereby granted and contingent upon the applicant having complied with the provisions of RCW 81.77 and the rules relating to solid waste companies. Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity No. G-97 shall be amended, as per the attached Appendix A.

4 The Commission further orders that the tariff filed in connection with this application will become effective at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the service date of this order.

GARBAGE COLLECTION SERVICE in that portion of Thurston County described as follows: Starting at the southeast corner of Section 12, T. 16 N., R. 1 W.; thence west along the south line of said Section 12 extended to the southwest corner of Section 9, T. 16 N., R. 3 W.; thence north along the west line of said Section 9 extended to the southeast corner of Section 32, T. 17 N., R. 3 W.; thence west along the south line of said Section 32 extended to the southwest corner of Section 35, T. 17 N., R. 4 W.; thence north along the west line of said Section 35 extended to the southeast corner of Section 34, T. 18 N., R. 4 W.; thence west along the south line of said Section 34 extended to the southwest corner of Section 33, T. 18 N., R. 4 W.; thence north along the west line of said Section 33 extended to the northwest corner of Section 21, T. 18 N., R. 4 W.; thence east along the north line of said Section 21 extended to the northeast corner of Section 20, T. 18 N., R. 3 W.; thence south along the east line of said Section 20 extended to the northwest corner of Section 33, T. 18 N., R. 3 W.; thence east along the north line of said Section 33 extended to the southeast corner of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 27, T. 18 N., R. 2 W.; thence north on a line projected to the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 10, T. 18 N., R. 2 W.; thence east along the north line of said section extended across Budd Inlet to the east shoreline of said inlet; thence following said east shoreline in a northerly direction to Boston Harbor; thence following the shoreline of Dana Passage in a northeasterly direction to Johnson Point; thence following the shoreline of Nisqually Reach in a southeasterly direction to the west bank of the Nisqually River; thence following said river bank in a southerly direction to a point where it intersects with the east line of Section 8, T. 18 N., R. 1 E.; thence south on the east line of said section projected to the S.E. corner of Section 32, T. 17 N., R. 1 E.; thence west on the south line of said section projected to the N.E. corner of Section 1, T. 16 N., R. 1 W.; thence south on the east line of said section projected to the S.E. corner of Section 12, T. 16 N., R. 1 W.; the point of beginning.

GARBAGE AND REFUSE COLLECTION SERVICE from the Cedar Creek Youth Camp (formerly Cedar Creek Youth Camp and Capitol Peak Forest Camp) located in Sections 11 and 12, T. 16 N., R. 4 W. in Thurston County, Washington.

The following authority was obtained by transfer of Cert. No. G-172 standing in the name of A.L. Parks, Sr., d/b/a Thurston County Recycling under authority of Order M.V.G. No. 911.

REFUSE COLLECTION SERVICE consisting of discarded paper and paper products, glass and metal all for recyclable purposes only in Thurston County.

THE FOLLOWING AUTHORITY WAS TRANSFERRED TO CERTIFICATE G-98; CERTIFICATE G-97 NO LONGER AUTHORIZES SOLID WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE in that portion of Thurston County described as follows:

Starting at southwest corner of Section 33, T18N, R4W, thence north along west line of said section extended to the northwest corner of Section 21, T18N, R4W, thence east along north line of said section extended to the northeast corner of Section 20, T18N, R3W, thence south along the east line of said section extended to the southeast corner of Section 32, T18N, R3W; thence west along the south line of said section extended to the southwest corner of Section 33, T18N, R4W, the point of beginning.

Also, within Section 33, T18N, R2W, a piece of territory bounded on the north by the north line of said section and on the south by Sapp Road. (The result will be a new boundary between the certificates of Sapp Road instead of the north line of Section 33.)

SOLID WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE in that portion of Thurston County described as follows:

Sections 7 and 8, T16N, R3W.
