## [Service Date May 27, 2004] BEFORE THE WASHINGTON STATE UTILITIES AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

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- 1 NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket No. UT-040535 involves a formal complaint alleging that Verizon Northwest Inc. (Verizon) violated WAC 480-120-165(2) relating to customer complaints and WAC 480-120-161(7)(b) concerning the form of bills and seeking an order assessing administrative penalties as appropriate under WAC 480-120-019.
- CONFERENCE. The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Olympia, Washington on Tuesday, May 25, 2004, before Administrative Law Judge Ann E. Rendahl.
- 3 APPEARANCES. Jeffrey D. Glick, President, Consider It Done, Limited, Bellevue, Washington, represents the Complainant. Timothy J. O'Connell, Stoel Rives LLP, Seattle, Washington, represents Verizon. Contact information provided at the conference for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this order.
- 4 **DISCOVERY.** It does not appear that discovery will be required in this proceeding. If the need for discovery becomes apparent later, any party may

request by motion that the Commission allow for discovery pursuant to the Commission's discovery rules, WAC 480-07-400 – 425.

5 **DISPOSITIVE MOTIONS.** Verizon requested the opportunity to file a motion for summary determination. The following schedule will govern briefing:

- 6 ISSUES. The parties discussed the issues that they believe to be involved, specifically, that the Complainant asserts that the issues are as stated in the formal complaint, and Verizon asserts that the issues are as stated in its Answer.
- 7 PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE. The parties agreed upon a procedural schedule during the conference. The Commission adopts this procedural schedule, which is attached to this Order as Appendix B, and incorporated into the body of this Order by this reference.
- 8 NOTICE OF HEARING. The Commission convenes a hearing in this matter, to address the matters raised in the formal complaint. The hearing will be held on Tuesday, September 14, 2004 at 9:30 a.m. in the Room 108 of the Commission's Offices in the Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S. W., Olympia, Washington.

- 9 DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS. Parties must file with the Commission an original plus four copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. Paper copies of these materials are required to conform to the format and publication guidelines set forth in WAC 480-07-395 and 480-07-460, and must be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.
- 10 All filings must be mailed or delivered to the Commission's Executive Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- Parties must provide an electronic copy of all filings by e-mail delivery to <<u>records@wutc.wa.gov</u>>. Alternatively, parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette including the filed document(s). The Commission prefers that parties furnish electronic copies in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format, supplemented by a separate file in MS Word 6.0 (or later), or WordPerfect 5.1 (or later) format. Parties are required to organize and identify electronic files as specified in WAC 480-07-140(5).
- 12 ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF DOCUMENTS. Pursuant to WAC 480-07-145(6), the presiding officer may grant parties a one-day extension of the paperfiling requirement, allowing electronic submission of documents with the Commission on the filing deadline. Parties may only submit documents electronically with the Commission in this proceeding with the permission of the presiding officer. If, at any time during this proceeding, parties are authorized to file documents with the Commission electronically under WAC 480-07-145(6),

Parties must submit the document to <u>records@wutc.wa.gov</u>, and file **an original**, **plus four** paper copies, of the document with the Commission by the following business day.

13 NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
