On March 21, 2011, Stericycle of Washington, Inc. (Stericycle), filed a complaint and 1 petition (complaint), with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) against Waste Management of Washington, Inc. (Waste Management). The complaint challenges the authority of Waste Management to engage in biomedical waste collection and transportation of compensation under G-237 without a specific grant of such authority by the Commission on the ground, among others, that Waste Management has long since abandoned any authority once provided by G-237 for such services and that the initiation of such services by Waste Management is therefore unauthorized and unlawful. Stericycle requests the Commission issue an order amending and restricting G-237 to expressly exclude biomedical waste collection and transportation services. The complaint is available for inspection at the Commission's office located at Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington, and on the Commission's web site at www.wutc.wa.gov/110553. It is appropriate that the matter raised in the pleading be brought for hearing before the Commission.

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- 2 On April 12, 2011, Waste Management filed a Motion to Dismiss Stericycle's Complaint and Petition.
- 3 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under RCW Title 81, and has legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of solid waste collection companies. The statutes that apply to this matter include RCW 80.01, RCW 80.04, and RCW 81.77, including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040 and RCW 80.04.020. The rules that apply to this matter include those within WAC 480-70, relating to solid waste collection companies.
- 4 The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.443, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in WAC 480-07 in this proceeding.
- 5 The Commission finds there is good cause to hear this matter on shortened notice. See WAC 480-07-440(1)(a).
- 6 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That a prehearing conference in this matter will be held on Friday, April 29, 2011, at 10:00 a.m., Second Floor, Room 206, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- 7 The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, resolve scheduling matters including establishing dates for distributing evidence and workpapers, to identify the issues in the proceeding and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430.
- 8 **INTERVENTION:** Persons who wish to intervene should file a petition to intervene in writing at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. *See* WAC 480-07-355(a). The Commission will consider oral petitions to intervene during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. Party representatives must file a notice of appearance with the Commission no later than the business day before the conference. *See* WAC 480-07-345(2). If any party or witness needs an interpreter or other assistance, they should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place

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- 9 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440. The Commission specifically invokes the sanction provisions of WAC 480-07-450 which allow the Commission to seek penalties for a party in default.
