ORDER GRANTING
EXEMPTION FROM RULE

BACKGROUND

- 1 On September 11, 2017, Pacific Power & Light Company (Pacific Power or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a petition requesting an exemption from WAC 480-80-121 (Petition).
- 2 WAC 480-80-121 requires that the Commission receive proposed tariff changes not less than 30 days in advance of the requested effective date.
- 3 In its Petition, Pacific Power states that, effective October 1, 2017, customers who have their renewable generation system certified with the Program Administrator, as defined by Senate Bill 5939, will receive an incentive as determined by the Program Administrator. In accordance with WAC 480-80-122, Pacific Power requests the Commission allow the tariff changes to become effective with less than statutory notice. Allowing less than statutory notice allows the Company's tariffs to be amended by October 1, 2017, in accordance with Senate Bill 5939. There will be no change in rates to customers.
- 4 Commission Staff reviewed the request and recommends the Commission grant Pacific Power's request for an exemption from WAC 480-80-121.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- 5 (1) The Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate the rates, rules, regulations, practices, accounts, securities,

transfers of property and affiliated interests of public service companies, including electric companies.

- 6 (2) Pacific Power is an electric company and a public service company subject to Commission jurisdiction.
- 7 (3) Pacific Power is subject to WAC 480-80-121, which provides that the Commission must receive tariff changes not less than thirty days in advance of requested effective date.
- 8 (4) Under WAC 480-110-215, the Commission may grant an exemption from the provisions of any rule in WAC 480-110, if consistent with the public interest, the purposes underlying regulation and applicable statutes. See also WAC 480-07-110.
- 9 (5) This matter came before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on September 28, 2017.
- 10 (6) After review of the petition filed in Docket UG-170952 by Pacific Power on September 11, 2017, and giving due consideration, the Commission finds that the exemption is in the public interest and is consistent with purposes underlying the regulation and applicable statutes and should be granted.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 11 (1) After the effective date of this Order, Pacific Power & Light Company is granted an exemption from WAC 480-80-121, Relating to Tariff Changes with Statutory Notice.
- 12 (2) The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and Pacific Power & Light Company to effectuate the provisions of this Order.

The Commissioners, having determined this Order to be consistent with the public interest, directed the Secretary to enter this Order.
