The Amendment provides the conditions under which the Parties may use Third Party Transit Provider to exchange traffic between their networks pursuant to Sections 6.2.1.1 and 6.3.1 of the Agreement.

The amendment amends the interconnection agreement first approved by the Commission on April 19, 2021 in WUTC Docket No. UT-210234.
