I am employed by the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) in the Freight Systems Division, State Rail Office. Since March 2007, I have served as the Rail Passenger Manager for the State Rail Office. Prior to a corporate restructuring of rail activities within WSDOT, I had served as the Manager of the Public Transportation and Rail Division, Rail Office from 1995 to March 2007.

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1. While I was the manager of the rail office, the Mount Vernon Siding Extension

project was assigned to members of my staff for execution. Jeffrey T. Schultz had project

management responsibilities and Elizabeth J. Phinney served as the Environmental Manager for

the project.

2. Throughout the development of the project, my staff provided me with both

formal and informal project status updates. I was fully briefed on outreach efforts with local and

regional officials in the Mount Vernon area. Staff and our consultants participated in numerous

meetings with interested parties. I was aware of the potential permitting requirements for the

project and was continuously updated as to the status of likely requirements from permitting

agencies. With staff, I reviewed technical documentation, studies and reports that were

developed by staff and consultants concerning the project. I conferred with staff about the

potential impacts of the project.

3. Based upon these discussions and the information that was presented to me, I was

comfortable that extensive outreach efforts had been taking place throughout the development of

the project and that the potential environmental impacts of the project were non-significant. A

State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA), Determination of Non-significance (DNS),

Environmental Checklist, a National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), Documented

Categorical Exclusion (DCE) were prepared for the project. These documents were supported by

the studies presented to me by staff. These studies were available for public review. In fact, the

traffic study was widely distributed by Jeffrey T. Schultz of my office prior to the issuance of the

SEPA DNS.

4. On February 16, 2007, WSDOT issued a SEPA DNS and an Environmental

Checklist under my signature for the Mount Vernon Siding Extension Project. The development

and delivery of this project was part of the rail capital program that I was responsible for

administering.
