1 PROCEEDINGS 2 JUDGE MACE: Let's be on the record in the 3 matter of Docket UT-011439. This is the petition of Verizon Northwest, Inc., for waiver of WAC 480-120-071 4 (2)(a). The date is July 17th, 2002, and we are 5 6 meeting here at the offices of the WUTC in Olympia, 7 Washington. 8 My name is Theo Mace. I'm the presiding administrative law judge. We are here today to 9 10 determine a further schedule of proceedings in light of 11 the Commission's recent order joining RCC as a party, 12 and I would also like to briefly address the Staff's motion to compel discovery before we close the 13 14 proceedings today. 15 I would like to take the appearances of counsel now and begin with Verizon, and I will then ask 16 17 if there is anyone on the conference bridge joining us 18 today. 19 MS. ENDEJAN: Good morning, Your Honor. I'm 20 Judith Endejan, and I'm here appearing for Verizon Northwest, Inc. I believe my business address is 21 22 already on the record. JUDGE MACE: You don't need to give your full 23 appearance if you've already done that. 24

25 MR. OWENS: Good morning, Your Honor.

Douglas Owens, counsel for Qwest Corporation. My 1 2 address and other information are also on the record. 3 MR. CROMWELL: Robert Cromwell on behalf of Public Counsel, Your Honor. 4 5 MR. TRAUTMAN: Greg Trautman, assistant б attorney general for Commission staff. 7 MR. BUSCH: Richard Busch with Miller Nash appearing on behalf of RCC. 8 9 JUDGE MACE: I understand that the conference 10 bridge is on. Is there anyone on the conference bridge 11 who seeks to enter an appearance today? Very well. It 12 appears there is no one on the conference bridge who wants to enter an appearance. 13 14 Mr. Busch, before you came into the hearing 15 room, I indicated the two things that we are to address today is the schedule of proceedings, but I also wanted 16 17 to briefly address the motion to compel the Staff had filed earlier. We had a discussion about that among 18 Staff, Qwest, and Verizon on, I believe it was... 19 20 MR. TRAUTMAN: July 9th. JUDGE MACE: Correct. First I would like to 21 22 ask if there is anything else that anyone wants to add 23 to our agenda today? 24 MS. ENDEJAN: Yes, Your Honor, and I'm not sure how you would procedurally like to handle this, 25

but Verizon would like to figure out the appropriate 1 2 procedural mechanism, perhaps an oral motion, perhaps a written motion, for extending the 18-month service 3 extension requirement contained in the line extension 4 rule. Because in light of the revision of the schedule 5 and in light of the construction season being shortened 6 by winter conditions, it doesn't appear likely for 7 Verizon to be ordered to do the extensions at issue it 8 9 could complete it within the 18-month window that is 10 set forth in the rule, so we would want to make sure 11 that that requirement is waived because we do not want 12 to be susceptible to the imposition of penalties. 13 JUDGE MACE: Does anyone here want to address 14 that before I address it?

MR. TRAUTMAN: In light of the extension of the briefing schedule and the additional time needed to file testimony and extend the hearing schedule, Staff would not object to that request.

19 JUDGE MACE: Would anyone object to such an 20 extension?

21 MR. BUSCH: RCC has no objection.

JUDGE MACE: I'm going to suggest that you do file a motion in writing. I don't believe there would be any problem with the granting of that motion, but it would be helpful for us to have that on the record in a

way that could be referred to by the Commissioners so
 we would just have something that would memorialize our
 discussion today. I don't foresee any problem with the
 granting of such an extension.

5 MS. ENDEJAN: Thank you, Your Honor.

б JUDGE MACE: Anything else of a preliminary nature we need to address before we go ahead? Then I 7 would like to turn to the motion to compel. My 8 understanding from our discussion by telephone on July 9 10 9th was that Staff was seeking information about the 11 Verizon Sultan exchange and the line extension in that exchange to serve nine customers -- I believe that took 12 place in 2001 -- and that Staff was seeking answers to 13 14 discovery questions, its Discovery Requests No. 89 to 15 91. I heard from the parties about that, and I ended up ruling that Verizon should supply that information 16 17 to Staff, and I was wondering what the status of that 18 is?

MS. ENDEJAN: Your Honor, I believe the information should be provided today, which was the date that it was supposed to be due, so I don't think there is an outstanding issue. I believe that the information was overnighted from Verizon's headquarters in Texas yesterday to Mr. Trautman.

25 JUDGE MACE: If there is any problem, I'm

1 sure you will advise me. 2 MR. TRAUTMAN: Yes. JUDGE MACE: Then if there is no other item, 3 we should probably turn to the question of the 4 procedural schedule. I want to advise the parties 5 6 because the Commission intends to preside at this 7 hearing, we have to consider the Commission's schedule, the broad schedule that involves the Commissioners' 8 9 time, and it appears that they are really not available 10 to hear anything until possibly October 2nd to 3rd but 11 more probably October 28th and 29th and conceivably 12 later. So when you are discussing schedule, which I will give you time to do, you want to bear that in 13 14 mind. 15 MS. ENDEJAN: What are those dates again? JUDGE MACE: October 2nd to 3rd is a 16 17 possibility. October 28th to 29th is highly probable. 18 October 31 to November 1st would also be probable, and 19 as you get into November, it's very easy to schedule

20 something, and I don't want to assume incorrectly that 21 two days will be sufficient. Because RCC is a party 22 now, that may change the amount of time that's required 23 for hearing, so you will have to consult with each 24 other about what amount of time is actually needed. 25 Is there anything else I should talk with you

about before I give you some time to discuss 1 scheduling? Then I'll give you 20 minutes and come 2 back and see how you are doing. Do you think you will 3 need 20 minutes? I'll come back in 20 minutes. 4 5 (Discussion off the record.) б JUDGE MACE: The parties have discussed scheduling, and they have advised me what they have 7 agreed on. It looks reasonable under the circumstance 8 that the Commission would not be able to preside at a 9 10 hearing during September or October of this year, also 11 because of the fact that RCC may be filing a motion to 12 join other parties to the proceeding and some time would be needed to consider that if such a motion were 13 14 filed. 15 So the schedule that was agreed upon and that

I will relate now for the record is Staff response to the Qwest filing is due September 20th. RCC will file November 6th. Parties will respond to RCC December 18th. RCC will reply January 7th of 2003. Hearing will be held January 21st through -- we need to decide how many days. I can't give the Commission a schedule that's that tentative, I think.

MS. ENDEJAN: Three should be enough.
JUDGE MACE: -- January 21st through 23rd
and a briefing date of February 21st. The parties have

further agreed that they will revert to a 10-day
 turnaround time for discovery since the schedule has
 been lengthened somewhat and would permit that type of
 turnaround time.

5 Also, we discussed the question of the date 6 for oral argument that was set in the earlier schedule 7 that we have devised. I believe because the Commissioners will be presiding at the hearing, we will 8 9 not need a date for oral argument, but we may need to 10 revisit that. Is there anything else that we need to 11 address at this point? Because Mr. Busch has not 12 entered his appearance on the record yet in this proceeding, I'm going to ask him now to make a 13 14 long-form appearance.
