- Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities (Avista) on April 5, 2006, filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a petition for an order authorizing implementation of a natural gas decoupling mechanism and to record accounting entries associated with the mechanism.
- STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under Title 80 RCW and has legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of gas utilities. The statutes that apply to this matter include chapters 80.01, 80.04 and 80.28 RCW relating to rates, including but not limited to RCW sections 80.01.040 and 80.04.020. The rules that apply to this matter include those within chapter 480-90 WAC, relating to gas companies.
- The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of chapter 34.05 RCW relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in chapter 480-07 WAC in this proceeding.
- The Commission finds there is good cause to hear this matter shortened notice. See, $WAC\ 480-07-440(1)(a)$.

THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a prehearing conference in this matter at 9:30 a.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be called, on September 6, 2006, at the 24th Floor Training Room, Bank of California, 900 4th Avenue, Seattle, Washington. All persons must check in at the receptionist desk, on the 20th floor of the Bank of California Building in order to gain access to the 24th Floor Training Room. The prehearing conference is set at the same time as a prehearing conference in Docket U-060273.¹

- The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for interventions, resolve scheduling matters including establishing dates for distributing of evidence and work papers, to identify the issues in the proceeding and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430.
- INTERVENTION: Persons who wish to intervene should file a petition to intervene in writing at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. See WAC 480-07-355(a). The Commission will consider oral petitions to intervene during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. Party representatives must file a notice of appearance with the Commission no later than the business day before the conference. See, WAC 480-07-345(2). If any party or witness needs an interpreter or other assistance, they should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for any evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference, on the record of a later conference or hearing session, or by later written notice.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440. The Commission specifically invokes the sanction provisions of WAC 480-07-450 which allow the Commission to seek penalties for a party in default.
