**NOTICE CANCELLING REQUEST FOR WRITTEN RESPONSES AND
ACCEPTING WITHDRAWAL OF PETITION FOR ADJUDICATION**

RE: *In re Application of Chariot Transit, Inc. For a Certificate to Operate as a Charter
Party and Excursion Service Carrier, Docket TE-170203*

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

On March 30, 2017, Chariot Transit, Inc. (Chariot Transit or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) an application for authority to operate as a charter party and excursion service carrier in Washington (Application) pursuant to Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 81.70 and Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-30.

On May 26, 2017, King County filed a Petition for Adjudication Pursuant to RCW 34.05.413 and WAC 480-07-305 (Petition). In its Petition, King County requests the Commission commence an adjudication to determine the scope of services Chariot Transit intends to offer. Specifically, King County sought clarification of the Company's proposal to "offer employers charter contracts for employee commuting solutions." On June 5, 2017, the Commission issued a notice requesting that Chariot Transit and Commission staff respond to the Petition by June 14, 2017.

On June 7, 2017, King County filed a stipulation between the County and the Company in which they agree to language that clarifies the nature and scope of Chariot Transit's proposed employee commuter service. King County represents that it withdraws its Petition contingent on the Commission including this language in any certificate it grants in response to the Application.

The Commission will include the stipulated language in any such certificate, and thus the Commission accepts King County's withdrawal of its Petition and cancels the request for responses to that Petition.

THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it cancels the request for responses to King County's Petition for Adjudication and accepts withdrawal of that Petition.
