ORDER 01

PARACOM, INC.

DENYING MITIGATION

in the amount of \$1,000

BACKGROUND

- On February 28, 2017, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission 1 (Commission) mailed annual report and regulatory fee forms to all telecommunications companies. The forms included a reminder that companies must file their annual reports and pay their regulatory fees by May 1, 2017, or face penalties of \$100 for each violation of Commission rules. In the case of continuing violations, each day's continuance is a separate violation. RCW 80.04.405.
- 2 Paracom, Inc. (Paracom or Company) did not file an annual report on May 1, 2017, and had not made that filing by May 15. On June 27, 2017, the Commission assessed a penalty of \$1,000 against Paracom, calculated as \$100 per business day from May 1 to May 15.
- On June 29, 2017, Paracom filed a complete annual report. On July 3, the Company 3 responded to the Commission's penalty assessment, admitting the violations and requesting mitigation based on the written information provided. In its response, the Company states, "For the first time in 10 years, since I have worked for Paracom, Inc., I filed my annual report late. The paperwork did not reach my desk, and all emails and correspondence from WUTC went to my boss, who is frequently out of town." The Company notes that its total gross intrastate operating revenue is \$3,000.
- On July 19, 2017, Commission staff (Staff) filed a response recommending the 4 Commission deny the Company's request for mitigation. The penalty assessment notified the Company that mitigation would only be granted if the Company could demonstrate

that the violations occurred due to circumstances beyond its control. Because Paracom failed to identify any such circumstances, Staff does not support the Company's request.

DISCUSSION

- WAC 480-120-382 requires telecommunications companies to file annual reports by May 1 of each year. Companies are responsible for complying with their legal obligations, and the Company should not rely on reminders from the Commission to ensure compliance.
- We agree with Staff that mitigation of the penalty is not appropriate in the circumstances presented here. The penalty assessment advised the Company that a request for mitigation will only be granted if the violations occurred due to circumstances beyond its control. Paracom's explanation for the violations that it overlooked the filing deadline is expressly identified in the penalty assessment as an unacceptable basis for mitigation. Accordingly, we find that Paracom failed to demonstrate that the violations occurred due to circumstances beyond its control, and conclude that its request for mitigation should be denied.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 7 (1) Paracom, Inc.'s request for mitigation of the \$1,000 penalty is DENIED.
- 8 (2) The \$1,000 penalty is due and payable no later than September 15, 2017.

¹ Those circumstances include, but are not limited to: death or serious illness of the person responsible for filing the report, or a member of that person's immediate family; destruction by fire or other casualty of the company's place of business or business records; or an act of fraud, embezzlement, theft, or conversion on the part of an employee. Circumstance that do not qualify as an acceptable basis for requesting mitigation include: financial hardship; a misunderstanding or lack of knowledge of Commission rules; failure to receive an annual report form from the Commission; mistakes or misconduct on the part of an employees; employee termination or turnover; personal events such as weddings or graduation ceremonies; and vacations or business trips.
